Our year 7 and 8 students focused really well during their assessments this week. These short assessments in English, Maths and Pupil's Attitudes to Learning were aimed at identifying any gaps in knowledge and understanding that our children may have. The outcomes will be used to inform teachers about each student's strengths and areas that teachers need to focus on more in their teaching to support

students in improving. This is so important following months of disrupted learning due to Covid. Students focused brilliantly during these assessments and tried their very best, please thank them too for the determination they showed.

I understand that Covid is still affecting many children and families. I wish you all well if you have been unwell. Attendance has been decreasing significantly across schools in England, as reported by the DfE and BBC this week. The attendance of our own students is increasing once more across year groups and there are fewer positive Covid cases. We are continuing to wear face masks in lessons and communal areas as we look to reduce any chance of transmission further. It is important that all parents for children in the 12-15 age bracket complete the form sent out about vaccinations - you have had correspondence via WEDUC. There is now more time to complete the consent form as unfortunately we have been told by the NHS team that vaccinations at Bosworth Academy will now take place sometime after half-term.

I really needed a 5km Parkrun on Saturday to burn off some calories (kilojoules) following a week of celebration with students during 'Headteacher's Breakfast'. Students from years 7 through to year 13 were nominated by their tutors for excelling during the first few weeks of term. Hot chocolate and pastries were enjoyed by all, which

Vaccination Important Update for 12-15 year olds

As you will be aware the government has announced that children aged between 12 and 15 will be offered one dose of the Covid-19 vaccine to provide good protection against severe illness and hospitalisation. Vaccinating 12 to 15 year olds should also help to reduce the need for young people to have time-off school and reduce the risk of spread of COVID-19 within schools. The COVID-19 secondary schools vaccine programme should therefore provide protection to young people and reduce the disruption to face to face education.

The vaccinations were due to take place on Thursday 14th October, but we have been contacted by the Local Healthcare Team informing us that they will now take place later this term. To complete a consent form visit www.leicsandrutlandimms.co.uk, select COVID-19 then add the code for Bosworth Academy which is LE137969. You will receive a confirmation email when the form is submitted. The system will close one working day before the vaccination session.

Actions to take if your child tests positive for COVID-19 If someone in your household has a positive lateral flow device (LFD) test taken at home:

- they should self-isolate straightaway and report their test result (to the NHS and to school)
- they should book a confirmatory PCR test as soon as possible, either <u>online</u>, through the NHS COVID-19 app, or by calling 119 and continue to self-isolate whilst awaiting results of the PCR test
- any unvaccinated adults in their household should self-isolate whilst awaiting their PCR result, unless they are <u>exempt</u>

(Exempt means; you are fully vaccinated, you are below the age of 18 years and 6 months, you are currently part of an approved COVID-19 vaccine trial, or you are not able to get vaccinated for medical reasons)

Happy Navaratri!

Mrs Mistry explains what Navratri is and why it is an important festival.

'Navaratri' means nine nights in Sanskrit, 'nava' meaning nine and 'ratri' meaning nights. On the tenth day, Goddess Durga, who is worshipped throughout the nine days, is immersed in holy water after Pooja. Thursday (7 October 2021) is the start of Navaratri, a nine-day festival dedicated to Mother Goddess, Durga.

This festival is celebrated for 9 nights which begins on October 7 and ends on October 15th. Also known as Sharda Navratri, this festival is observed in Hindu Lunar month called Ashwin. Bengalis celebrate Durgo Puja during these 9 days by paying their respect to the nine incarnations of goddess Durga.

- On the first day, devotees worship the daughter of the mountain, Goddess Shailputri.
- On the second day, they worship Brahmacharini, the unmarried avatar of Goddess Parvati.
- The third is dedicated to Chandraghanta.
- The fourth day, devotees worship Goddess Kushmanda who is said to be the creative power of the universe.
- Fifth day is for Goddess Skandamata.
- On the sixth day, devotees worship warrior Goddess Katyayani.
- On the seventh day, Goddess Kaalratri is worshipped.
- The eight day is for Goddess Mahagauri
- The ninth day is dedicated to Goddess Siddhidatri.
- On the last day, Vijaya Dashmani is celebrated when the idols are carried in processions and then immersed in water.


Hindus celebrate this with devotion and enthusiasm throughout India. The celebration lasts for nine days with an extra day on the end named Dusshera (celebrating good over evil!), the last four days are very important.

During the nine day celebration, there is a feeling of festivity in the air. Many people fast during the entire period, there are different forms of prayers and lots of varieties of sweets are prepared.

Different parts of India celebrate Navaratri in different style, however the thing that is common is its grandeur and auspiciousness. In Gujarat, people do dandiya and garba, a beautiful folk dance, wearing colourful dresses.

Historically in Leicester temples and community centres celebrate Navaratri into the early hours of the morning with families from all over the country. Last year, Navratri was celebrated differently, however this year as we embrace the 'new normal', we are encouraging those to celebrate the nine days safely and follow government guidelines and any local restrictions.

Attendance Matters, Every Day Counts

It is vital that all students have excellent attendance at Bosworth Academy. Research shows that even a few days of absence can have a negative impact on students' performance. Bosworth Academy is committed to working with students and parents/carers to achieve the attendance target of 97%.

Bosworth Academy operates the following attendance grid when reporting to parents/carers:

98% & above Excellent 96-97.9% Good 95-95.9% Satisfactory 90-94.9% Cause for Concern 90% & below Unacceptable

*We take into consideration any illness due to a positive Covid PCR Test. Therefore any Covid absence will not negatively impact on the students attendance.

Attendance Expectations

- The school day begins at 8.40am and all students are expected to be in school by this time, regardless of the distance they may have to travel. Students who arrive after 8.40am, during tutor time will have a consequence issued (unless they travel on the 153). Students arriving after this time must sign in at the attendance office.
- The School operates the Truancy Call System to notify parents/carers if their child has not arrived in school.
- Parents/carers can help by notifying us in advance about planned absences, and arrange medical or dental appointments outside the school day, where possible.
- Bosworth Academy requests that parents/carers contact the School by 9.30am to let us know if their son/daughter is going to be absent.
- Parents/carers are strongly advised to avoid taking their children on holiday during term time and requests during term time will not be authorised. In exceptional circumstances, written requests for extended leave should be made in advance to the Headteacher. Please be aware that there are assessments and trial exams throughout the academic year for all year groups.

Tutors, Heads of Year and members of the Attendance Team regularly hold 'Attendance Matters' conversations with students so that they realise the importance of high levels of attendance. Students and parents/carers are actively encouraged to keep track of students' attendance through the Weduc app.

Bosworth Academy rewards students who have excellent attendance through reward points, postcards home and a termly/ Monthly prize draw to win vouchers, in addition to the opportunity to take part in end of year rewards.
