Nuffield Research Placements

What is a Nuffield Research Placement?

It is a 2-3 week placements over the summer holidays. Students will participate in real life research at a higher institution or a STEM based company. The students will complete the research and write a scientific report and poster on the research they have completed. This will be showcased at a celebration event in front of their peers, parents, STEM ambassadors and the school.

Benefits of Nuffield Research Placements:

- Learning and developing new skills
- Participation in real life research
- Opportunity to submit scientific report to competitions & awards (CREST awards and Big Bang Competition)
- New experiences to write about on their UCAS application and make them stand out
- Bursary incentive and travel costs covered

Eligibility Criteria

- Students need to be in Year 12 and in full-time education
- Students must be studying 1 or more A-Levels in a STEM based subject, also including social sciences (sociology, psychology, history & geography)
- Students must have at least 5 GCSEs at Level 6 or above
- The student is the first in family to go to higher education
- The student comes from a low income household (less than 30K a year) or have received free school meals in the past 6 years.
