21_{St} January 2022 I am delighted to share this week some stories of student success and promote the wealth of opportunities available to Bosworth Academy students. That is so important in a week of political turmoil. Covid related announcements which included the gloomy titled 'Blue Monday'.

Weekly Newsletter for parents & Students As a result of the government announcement on Wednesday, the Plan B measures for schools are being removed. This advice remains subject to change as the situation develops. COVID-19 continues to be a virus that we learn to live with and the imperative to reduce the disruption to young people's education remains. We remain committed at Bosworth to providing excellent learning experiences for our students whilst keeping them safe. Though our staff have excelled with remote learning the evidence is clear that being out of the classroom harms deep understanding, progress and mental and physical health.

As I shared on Wednesday evening, from Thursday 20 January, face masks are no longer recommended in classrooms and teaching spaces for staff, and students. Face masks are still required in communal areas, including on transport until Thursday 27 January. (Public health may still recommend the use of face masks in communal areas, beyond 27 January if there are specific health concerns).

As the virus is still with us, we need to continue with proportionate protective measures which remain vital to protect education. This will include frequent use of sanitiser, wiping down tables more frequently and practising good hygiene. Of course, students and staff who still wish to



wear a face mask in lessons are able to during this time where they may feel at risk. On Thursday many students were relieved to hear that they could remove their face masks in lessons. A few continue to choose to wear them sensibly, which is absolutely fine. Our students have observed this risk mitigation throughout this term brilliantly, without any fuss, and this has been so reassuring to our staff who regularly work closely with 180 students a day.

On Monday evening our senior leadership team met with parents of many of our year 11 students. The focus for all exam years is now all about focused revision and dedicated practice as they prepare for the summer examinations. Learning can happen at all times, at home and at school. We are offering many revision classes at the end of the school day and sometimes at break times - which increasing numbers of students are accessing. You can also use The Compass (our library) to study at the end of a school day.

In year 8, our students are considering the decisions they need to make as part of our option process. There is

a brilliant array of subjects on offer and some important decisions ahead. Please read on for more information.

Finally, as Kofi Annan, the Nobel Peace Prize laureate, and Secretary-General of the United Nations said, "Knowledge is power. Information is liberating. Education is the premise of progress, in every society, in every family." Let's continue to talk to our children about the importance of learning in expanding their horizons and giving them a true sense of accomplishment.

We are pleased to share information regarding a new online homework and assessment tool that we are now using in the English department for years 10 &11.

Educake is a website where students are able to answer targeted homework questions which are set weekly by their teachers to improve their knowledge and understanding. When students take the quiz, they'll get immediate feedback and so will their teacher. Educake can also help students be more efficient with their revision by enabling them to set themselves a test on any topic, and they can guide their own learning with the Track Progress page, which shows them where their strengths and areas for development are. All students have already received an Educake sticker with their login details and on the first day alone students completed over **9000** questions!

There will be weekly prizes and the top performing class in each year group will receive a cake during the final week of each half term to reward them for their efforts.



The DofE award scheme is an incredible lifechanging adventure that helps young people to develop and grow through learning new skills for work and life, getting fitter, helping others and exploring the countryside.

Over the next few weeks there will be a presentation

Budding Entrepreneur

JayJay Rathod, a year 12 student has started his own business (JJ confectionery) to earn some money during his A Levels. JayJay studied GCSE Business at Bosworth and has continued into A Level Business and is putting his knowledge and skills into practice. He started his Business in May 2021 as he was finishing his GCSEs, selling American candy boxes to the public after he noticed a gap in the market for this type of product. He set up a successful supply chain for the candy and boxes, implemented a competitive and profitable pricing strategy and hit social media to start selling. He uses Instagram, facebook and snapchat. The business started by putting together candy boxes that he either posted or delivered in person but he is now wanting to expand the business into catering and parties. He spends around 5-10 hours a week on the business which compliments his A Level studies well.

Bosworth Academy Smash Bros ESports Competition

Monday 10th January saw the exciting launch of the Bosworth Academy Smash Bros ESports competition. The first round of competition involved year 13 students competing in singles and doubles matches to find a winner to progress through to the Champions Final. Further competitions took place involving different year group players to enable the 50+ students that have signed up to take part and to determine who will be first choice for the Bosworth BUGs (Bosworth Union of Gamers), the Academy's new ESports named voted for by the student population. On Thursday 27th January, the winning Bosworth players will play off against the winning Countesthorpe Academy players to decide the team that will go on to compete against other schools in the national Digital SchoolHouse competition. We will also be hosting a separate female player playoff to find our top 2 females who will take up a spot in the 3 team Bosworth BUGs or Countesthorpe Cobras teams. One of these team will win the chance to progress through to The Grand Final which last year was held at the Gfinity Esports Arena as part of the London Games Festival. The event was streamed live with over 1000 viewers.

My thanks to Ethan Gratton and Rob Newman who have taken on the role of Student Chief Executive Officer and Chief Operations Officer and will be responsible for the organisation of the Smash Bros Competition. Ethan and Rob have been invaluable in getting things set up and administering the tournaments.

Esports is a fast growing and evolving industry, engaging millions of students across the globe both in competitive play and as a new form of entertainment. with the industry expected to surpass \$2bn revenue by 2020. It is an amazingly inclusive form of entertainment, presenting opportunities for all regardless of age, physical abilities or gender. It is a very creative vet technical industry adopting existing skill sets across the video games, broadcast, media and sport industries all the while creating many new highly skilled roles. The Academy is excited about the opportunity to inspire more students through technology and digital creativity and for them to discover exciting and successful career prospects in a rapidly changing world. Moving forward the Academy will look to run additional competitions and create its own Gaming Arena on site for both student use and use by the local community. I am very excited about the opportunities being explored and the role that students will play in driving this forward. Fortunately

World Religion Day Sunday 16th January

Students have been learning about World Religion Day this week during tutor time.

World Religion Day is celebrated every January on the third Sunday of the month. In 2022, that fell on the 16th of January. Its aim is to promote understanding and peace between all religions, encouraging people to learn about other faiths and their followers. The first such day was observed in 1950.

It was initially started by followers of the Bahá'í faith, which says that all religions have common features, and that they should be respected equally. They believe there is one God who is known by different names in all religions. Followers of the Bahá'í faith believe that all humans are born equal, and that we all have the same rights regardless of our faith. World Religion Day aims to promote the unity of religious peoples so that we can overcome historical differences. For centuries, different religions and faiths have fought each other, and ignored their common values. The purpose of World Religion Day is to work towards a peaceful understanding between faiths.

New self-isolation measures

From Monday 17 January, people with COVID -19 can end their self-isolation after 5 full days, as long as they test negative on day 5 and day 6 and do not have a high temperature.

For a return to school on day 6 the first test must be taken on the morning of day 5 of the self-isolation period, and the second must be taken 24 hours later on the following morning on day 6. If both are negative then the student may return to school on day 6.

It is essential that 2 negative rapid lateral flow tests are taken on consecutive days and reported to school via attend-

ance@bosworthacademy.org.uk before individuals return to school, if leaving self-isolation earlier than the full 10-day period.

How five-day isolation rule works in England



If an individual is positive on day 5, then a negative test is required on day 6 and day 7 to release them from isolation. For instance, if an individual is positive on day 5, then a negative test is required on both day 6 and day 7 to release from self-isolation, or positive on day 6, then a negative test is required on days 7 and 8, and so on until the end of day 10. You may stop isolation on day 11 regardless of a LFD test result as long as you do not have a high temperature.

Those who leave self-isolation on or after day 6 are strongly advised to wear a face mask and follow our risk mitigation plan carefully.






Reading Rampage is here!
