

Welcome

Yesterday we held an important intervention for our year 11 students. A 'Maximising Potential' workshop focused on helping students realise their potential as we approach the countdown to GCSE examinations. Motivating examples of perseverance, resilience and practice were used throughout as well as successful revision strategies. Do talk to your child about what they learned and which learning approaches they will now put in place. Soon we will be announcing details to our Sixth Form students about a similar event next half-term.



Monday 7th February should see exam boards announcing any changes to GCSE/AS/A level **summer examinations**. I'm sure this will be shared via the media channels. We will of course be doing all we can to ensure our students are well informed for every subject they study. Further details will follow as soon as we know more.

This week's assembly has focused on LGBT+ History Month - an annual celebration with the theme 'Why is it important to have pride?' Five of our students led assemblies supported by our staff. **The Bosworth Academy Rainbow pin badge** was launched which has been superbly designed by a student in year 12. The badges are one of the many ways we are trying to show staff and students that our school is an inclusive and supportive place for everybody.

As you are aware throughout the COVID 19 pandemic, Bosworth Academy has been working alongside Leicestershire County Council and The UK Health Security Agency (UKHSA) to consider measures to reduce the transmission of COVID-19 within the school community. Maintaining a full curriculum and maximising face-to-face education, whilst minimising disruption, in a way that best manages the COVID-19 risk is our priority. Since 27/01/2022, when Plan B measures were lifted nationally we have seen an increase in Covid-19 cases. **I am now very concerned that positive Covid cases among our staff will likely result in the education of students in school being affected if we do not reintroduce further risk mitigation measures.**

Therefore, in line with the Government's contingency framework, it has been recommended that Bosworth Academy **reintroduce face masks in classrooms, corridors, communal areas and school buses** for a **two-week period**, in order to manage the transmission of COVID-19. This will be **effective from Monday 7th February**. Please [read this letter from Public Health](#).



Wearing a face mask is an effective way of reducing the risk and minimising the disruption of COVID-19 transmission within the school. I will continue to liaise with the relevant bodies to monitor the number of positive cases and the impact the current measures are having. Though none of us like wearing face masks I hope students will have a high level of compliance for this period of time as they have whenever we have needed them to be worn.



I must pay real **credit to our staff** who have gone above and beyond this week to maintain a high-quality learning experience for our students. Part-time staff have come in on their day off, teachers and support staff have taken on extra duties and colleagues have taught live lessons remotely from home. This has enabled us to continue with our rich curriculum and maintain strong student-teacher relationships.

Finally, one of the motivational figures highlighted in the year 11 workshop was the boxer **Muhammad Ali**. I think his quote, **"Don't count the days; make the days count."** is a great one for us all to live by.

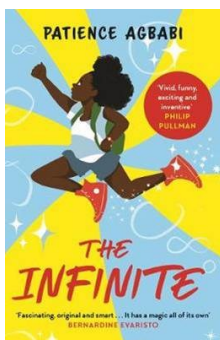
Y7 'Bookbuzz' Reading Challenge

Elle is a Leapling: born on a leap day (29th February) and with the ability to leap backwards and forwards through time. On her twelfth birthday she'll take her first official leap, on a school field trip to 2048. They'll visit the Time Squad Centre, a time-travelling crime-fighting organisation. But when Elle, in 2020, receives a cryptic SOS text message sent from someone in 2048 she knows something is wrong in the future. Who sent it? Why?

Someone's in trouble in 2048 – and it's up to Elle to figure out who it is, and how to save them.

A time-travelling science fiction adventure combined with crime mystery, *The Infinite* is fresh, exciting, bold and witty. Elle loves running, white food and her Nigerian heritage, but she dislikes eye contact, being stared at, too much noise, bullies and anything that makes her head too full. Managing everyday experiences can be hard, but her determination, curiosity and intelligence help her pursue her goals while the sparky friendship between Elle and her best friend Big Ben is touching and entertaining.

A diverse cast of unique individuals, a complex narrator, and a character-driven plot with ethical undertones makes this a book not to be missed.

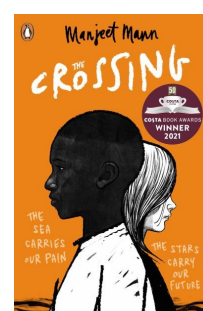
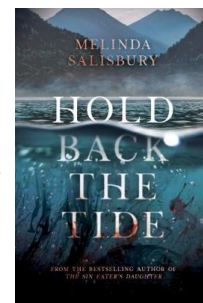

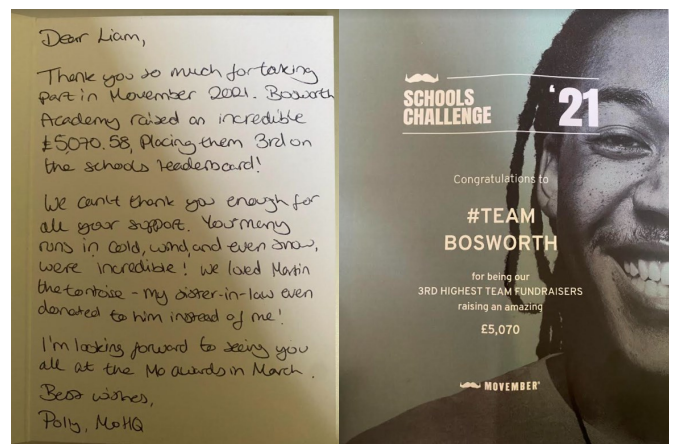

Second COVID-19 dose for 12-15-year-olds

In line with government guidelines, the school immunization team we will be revisiting Bosworth Academy on Thursday 10th and Friday 11th February to offer them the chance to have their second COVID-19 vaccination – or the chance to have their first COVID 19 jab if they haven't already got the protection of the vaccine. For those students eligible for a second dose of the COVID-19 vaccine, this will help to bolster their protection, particularly in light of the highly contagious Omicron variant of the virus.

The next visit will also provide those young people who were not vaccinated on our last visit, because they may have been absent on the day, not yet 12 years old or because they decided not to have the vaccine at the time, with a new opportunity to have the vaccine.

Parents of eligible students have been sent a letter with a link to the online consent form, as well as a contact number if you need support in completing the form. A new consent is required for the second vaccine and the first if it was missed last time. The vaccine used will be Pfizer-BioNTech, which is administered via a quick injection in the top of the arm.

Healthy children who have tested positive for COVID-19 need to wait 12 weeks before they can have the vaccine. Second doses also have to be 12 weeks from the young person's initial first dose.

How to Set up PARENTAL CONTROLS for APPS iPhone

Apple devices come with built-in apps already available: Mail, FaceTime and Safari, for example. However, you can choose which apps and features appear on your child's device and which ones don't. You can also manipulate the features in Game Centre to enhance your child's safety and privacy when playing games, as well as blocking iTunes or App Store purchases if you wish.



How to Restrict Built-in Apps/Features

- 1 Open Settings
- 2 Tap Screen Time
- 3 Tap Content & Privacy Restrictions
- 4 Tap Allowed Apps (you may need to toggle this to 'on' at the top)
- 5 Enable or disable the apps you wish to appear (or disappear) on your child's device

How to Restrict Game Centre

- 1 Open Settings
- 2 Tap Screen Time
- 3 Tap Content & Privacy Restrictions
- 4 Tap Content Restrictions (you may need to switch the toggle at the top to the 'on' position)
- 5 Scroll down to Game Centre
- 6 Choose between Allow, Don't Allow, or Allow with Friends Only in the settings for each feature

How to Restrict iTunes & App Store Purchases

- 1 Open Settings
- 2 Tap Screen Time
- 3 Tap Content & Privacy Restrictions
- 4 Tap iTunes & App Store Purchases
- 5 Select Allow or Don't Allow for each feature (you can also lock these settings with a password)

How to Set up PARENTAL CONTROLS for PRIVACY iPhone

The privacy settings on your child's Apple device give you control over the information stored on it. This allows you to select which apps can access features and information on your child's device: for example, you might wish to block a social networking app from connecting to the camera reel, or specify which apps can use the device's location data.

How to make changes to privacy settings

You can block certain apps from obtaining information from your child's device. You can also prevent your child (or anyone other than you) from altering these settings.

1 Open 'Settings'

2 Tap 'Screen Time'

3 Tap 'Content & Privacy Restrictions'

4 Scroll to 'Privacy'

5 Choose the settings you wish to restrict

6 After you've made any changes, select 'Use Screen Time Passcode' to lock your changes with a PIN

How to prevent changes to other settings/features

You can also stop changes being made to the iPhone's other settings or features by anyone but you. For example, you can prevent your child from altering their passcode, accounts or mobile data settings.

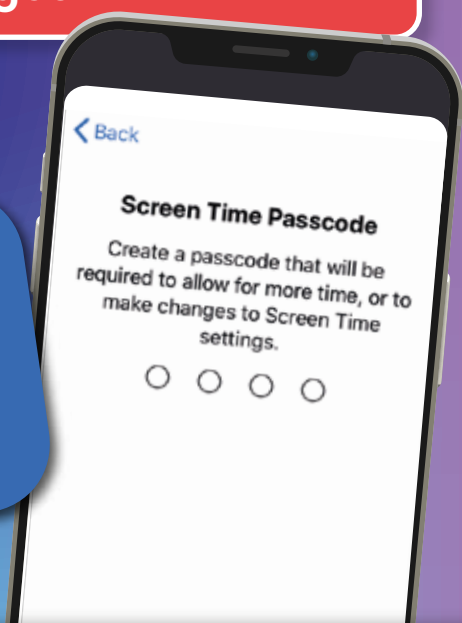
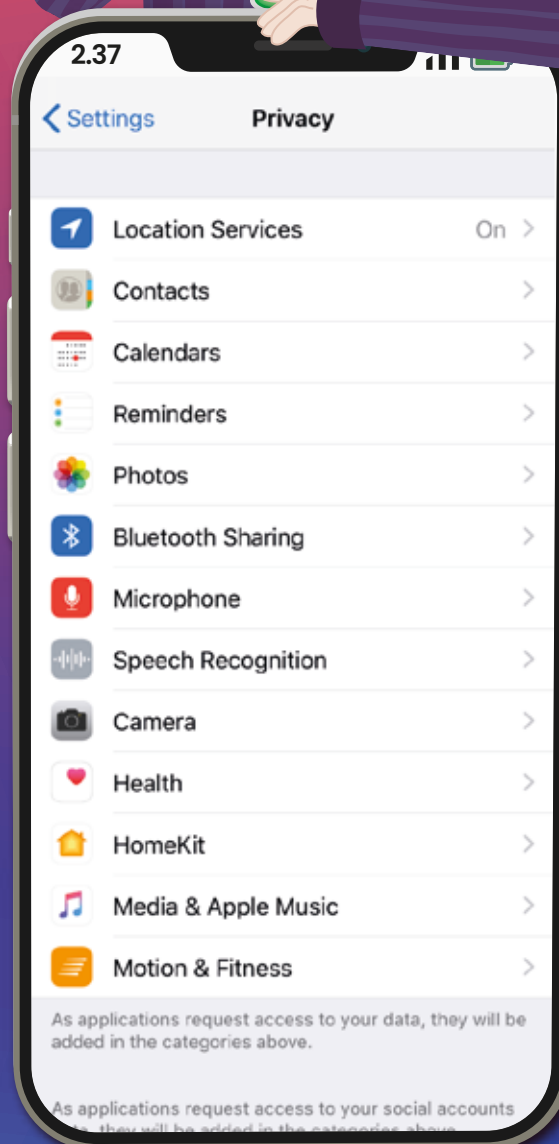
