I'd like to thank all parents and carers for your support through what has been a challenging term. Through the 'living with Covid' period we saw a rise in positive cases among students and staff bringing many challenges for us all. Attendance figures published nationally showed that a fifth of schools had more than 15% of teachers absent last week. Yet, by working together as a community you will have seen from our weekly newsletters the amazing experiences and achievements of our students have continued. Let's hope all work sectors can get back to normal soon.



This week, Ms Hussain and Mr Ahmed led special Ramadan assemblies explaining why Muslims fast during Ramadan. Our students were brilliantly engaged and learned about the spiritual and physical benefits of fasting. I'd like to wish all those fasting a Happy Ramadan Mubarak.

On Tuesday our exam year students in 11, 12 and 13 received their second set of trial (mock) examination results. Year 11 students and their parents collected them at an evening event where we explained how to make best use of the 'Advanced Information Checklists' for

focused revision. Students who make best use of this information this year will no doubt gain a real advantage when it comes to sitting the examination papers which begin in just 5 weeks time! Please reinforce with your son/ daughter the importance of following a revision plan and in completing active revision; Understand-Process-Create-Revise. They may need some help in locating their class books and revision guides to learn from as well as the wealth of online resources.

This week our students were all involved in commemorating Stephen Lawrence Day. Throughout the week

students have been engaged in various learning activities to raise their awareness of inequality. Stephen Lawrence Day is a chance for our students to be part of a national conversation, showing commitment to creating a fairer society where everyone has the opportunity to live their best life. In addition to this our key stage 4 students attended an informative discussion session with Dr Kennetta Hammond Perry from the Stephen Lawrence Research Centre at De Montfort University, where we joined her via a 'live' remote link.

Covid-19 update

On Tuesday 29 March, the Secretary of State for Health and Social Care, Sajid Javid, set out the next steps for living with COVID-19 in England from Friday 1 April. The guidance now states that young people who are unwell and have a high temperature should stay at home and avoid contact with other people. They may return to school when they no longer have a high temperature, and they are well enough to attend. Young people aged 18 and under with a positive COVID-19 test result should try to stay at home and avoid contact with other people for 3 days. A young girl picks up a book at a second hand shop and becomes drawn into the mystery behind the disappearance of its previous owner

Aveline Jones loves ghost stories. But when she buys a second-hand book of spooky tales, only to find the last story crossed out by its previous owner, she is



drawn into the disappearance of a girl called Primrose Penberthy, thirty years ago. As Aveline discovers the truth, Halloween draws ever closer and something dark begins to stir...



Y8 'Reading Rampage 2022' Reading Challenge

A young girl campaigns for historic wrongs to be righted, whilst also dealing with her autism.

A kind of spark tells the story of 11-yearold Addie as she campaigns for a memorial in memory of the witch trials


that took place in her Scottish hometown. Addie knows there's more to the story of these 'witches', just like there is more to hers. Can Addie challenge how the people in her town see her, and her autism, and make her voice heard?

Drawing parallels between the outsider status of a young girl with autism and that of women accused of witchcraft centuries before, this novel centres on 11-year-old Addie and her fight for historical wrongs to be recognised. The author herself has autism and this is a sensitive portrayal of those living with the condition.
