where Bosworth Academy students have a high success rate. This week I was delighted to interview two of our Oxbridge applicants aiming to study Biochemistry and History degrees. Our students have already written personal statements which include a compelling narrative, and outline the many extra-curricular activities and opportunities that make them desirable to admissions tutors. It was so interesting to hear 'How would you measure pH if I told you how many hydrogen ions there were in a solution?' and about 'Hitler's failings on D-Day'. Though these interviews are challenging, students find them great preparation for the actual interview, some of which are carried out remotely. If your son/daughter would like an opportunity to be involved then please get in touch with Dr. Stephenson, Head of Year 13.

Over the last few weeks we have been visiting many lessons across our school looking at student learning. Though the vast majority of our students across Key Stages 3 and 4 are focused on learning and rising to every challenge there are a few students who do not respond quickly to their teachers. This is unfair on their peers so consequences are used to ensure students are self-reflective and re-engage. If a student continues to slow down learning and has to be removed from the lesson then parents will be informed. That child will then be expected to attend an after school session the following day. As always, parents will be contacted in advance of this. In



assemblies this week we have reminded students of our high expectations in lessons and around our school, and the simple routines that help support us all to achieve. Our many reward systems recognise those students **'being better than they thought they could be'** and in the final week of term we look forward to our Year 9, 10 and 11 Colours Awards Evening and Celebration Assemblies across every year group.

We have more observations to complete during the last two weeks of term and I know that the staff completing the observations are looking forward to seeing lots of great lessons where students are engaging with their learning and are making excellent progress.

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#### **Adlington to Start Swim**

Bosworth Academy will host a charity 10K swim later this month and Olympic gold medallist, Rebecca Adlington, will be starting the swimmers off on their pursuit.



The swim has been organised by former student, Rachel Tuckey, in aid of Leicester Hospitals Charity, as part of Rachel's four-stage challenge. Rachel's four-yearold son was born with severe health problems and Rachel says she "really wanted to

not only give something back to those who saved our son's life, but also to support other families who might go through what we did. If the money I raise can help save at least one family then it has all been worth it.

"Oscar turned four in September, a milestone we didn't know we would meet; hence the four challenges. I knew I wanted to do four challenges, but I didn't really know where to start - I got the inspiration for the challenges from the four elements; Earth, Air, Water and Fire," says Rachel.

There have been two challenges so far where Rachel has climbed the Yorkshire Three Peaks (Earth) and did a 13,000 feet tandem skydive (Air) - raising over £6,000 so far for Leicester Hospitals Charity.



Rachel, who attended Bosworth Academy

between 1996-2000, will be accompanied by five friends for the swim on Sunday 18 December at 9AM and is "absolutely overwhelmed" that Rebecca Adlington will be starting them off in the school's swimming pool in association with Total Swimming Academies.

"The support that Bosworth Academy and Total Swimming Academies have given to me and the rest of the swimmers for this challenge is unbelievable, and for Rebecca Adlington to take time out of her busy schedule to support us in our plight is just gobsmacking!

"There is definitely a combination of excitement and fear for her being there on the day... Excitement that she will be part of our memories of this event for the rest of our lives, and fear that we hope one of us doesn't false start under all the excitement!!" says Rachel.

Rebecca Adlington says that Rachel's four stage challenge is "so inspiring".

"I'm really looking forward to being there that morning to start the 10k swim. It's such a tough challenge but hopefully can raise lots of money and awareness for a fantastic charity," added Rebecca. 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

#### Key Stage Three

A retelling of the story of the RMS Titanic. April 1912: the Titanic, the so called Ship of Dreams, sets sail with over 2,000 men, women and children on board. It was a historic moment and should have been one of the safest. most luxurious journeys to America. But when the ship hit an iceberg in the



middle of the Atlantic Ocean its maiden voyage became a nightmare and the Titanic quickly sank taking her crew and passengers with her. In this gripping and fact-filled retelling David Long brings to life the history of the "unsinkable" Titanic, its creation and its doomed maiden voyage.

#### Key Stage Four

Having sustained a brain injury in the car crash that killed his long-term girlfriend, a boy thinks noone will understand what he's gone through until he meets a girl who has her own healing to do. Can you find true love after losing everything? Kyle and Kimberly have been the perfect couple all through high school, but when Kimberly breaks up with him on the night of their graduation party,

Kyle's entire world upends-literally. Their car crashes and when he awakes, he has a brain injury. Kimberly is dead. And no one in his life could possibly understand. Until Marley. Marley is suffering from her own loss. a loss she thinks was her fault. And when their paths cross, Kyle sees in her all the



unspoken things he's feeling.

As Kyle and Marley work to heal each other's wounds, their feelings for each other grow stronger. But Kyle can't shake the sense that he's headed for another crashing moment that will blow up his life as soon as he's started to put it back together.

And he's right.
