Welcome

13th January 2023 It has been an emotional week for some of our examination year students. On Tuesday we had our Year 11 Trial Examination Results Evening.



Weekly Newsletter for Parents & Students Students, accompanied by their parents or carers picked up their result envelopes, experiencing what this may 'feel' like in the summer. Some students were delighted with their outcomes whilst others were disappointed, knowing that they can do better. During the evening we shared with parents how to best support their child over the coming months and explained what to expect in the actual GCSE exams and some key dates.

Leaders in English and Maths then presented to smaller groups about how specific approaches in their subject could really help students to raise their grades. A link to some of the slides shared on the evening can be found here.

On Wednesday afternoon there was a real buzz of activity as our Sixth Form students picked up their results from November Trial Examinations. Once more there was a mix of joy and a little disappointment. Learning from our mistakes and targeting areas for improvement are the key to future success and these milestone assessments will help both students and their teachers as we look to build on success. We hope now to see students creating and quickly following a well-planned revision timetable. Tutors are now supporting students with this across both key stages.

With our new basketball, football and tennis courts now open I was delighted to meet with a group of Year 10 student leaders who spoke to me about their ideas for basketball. They had designed a layout that fits with our Bosworth brand and mirrors some of the professional clubs. It was great to hear them pitch a well thought out

idea. Their next steps are to design a Bosworth Academy Basketball logo and to research costings.

In our Maximising Potential workshop sessions on Thursday with Year 11 students we listened to some great tips on revision, and some inspiring stories including one about a 5ft3in successful basketball player, Tyrone Bogues. We learned about the **Pomodoro** revision technique to beat revision procrastination and improve student focus one 'pomodoro' at a time. This method would work for any student in any year preparing and revising for a test or assessment. The idea is to work in 25 minute chunks with a 5 minute break really helping focus. Students should put two, three or maybe even four chunks together as they build up towards an



assessment. This could well be something useful for us adults as well to boost our own productivity! I'll conclude this week with an inspirational quote from the great basketball player, Michael Jordan who stated, "My attitude is that if you push me towards something that you think is a weakness, then I will turn that perceived weakness into a strength." Great advice for any of our students! Have a lovely weekend,

Year 11 Trial Exam Results

On Tuesday Year 11 students, accompanied by their parents/carers, received the results of their trial exams that were taken last term.



Trial exams allow students and teachers to see current progress and identify areas to focus on for upcoming exam revision. Following the receiving of the results, students

and their parents/carers were invited to a presentation given by Headteacher, Mr Brown, and Head of Kev Stage Four. Assistant Headteacher Mr Worn.

Mr Brown discussed the government directive that the 2023 exams will nearly be back to normal following the COVID-19 pandemic.

Ofqual have confirmed that grading will be back in line with 2019 for 2023 but students will continue to be provided with support in



GCSE Maths, Physics and Combined Science subjects with formulae and equation sheets provided. There will be no advanced information about exam content like there was in 2022. Results will be based purely on exam performance, and coursework, if part of the qualification.

There will be further trial exams in the week commencing 6 March 2023 and the performance of the two sets of trial exams must be retained as a record in case of illness or an unlikely situation that exams do not go ahead.

The summer examination period begins on Monday 15 May. After the May half term students will receive a personalised timetable with no official study leave period.

The last day of GCSE examinations is Wednesday 28 June and students are invited to attend the Year 11 Prom later on the same day. Full details of the Year 11 Prom will be released at a later date. For further questions about your trial exam results please contact your relevant teachers.

Maximise Your Potential

On Thursday Year 11 students were given an insight into challenging themselves to reach their full potential by visitor, Jasper Ward, from Maximize Your Potential.



Jasper, who is also an examiner, shared with the students how preparing for your GCSEs now will set you up for a future of opportunities and how careers ranging from plumbers to paramedics can have a positive influence on people's lives. Revision techniques and having a positive workrest balance were also discussed after Jasper recounted the career of Tyrone Curtis "Muggsy" Boque, whose dedication to training led to his success as the smallest man ever to play in the NBA at 5 foot 3 inches.

The sessions were insightful for the students who will now put the strategies into action as they prepare for their GCSEs at the end of the academic year.

Post 16 Trial Exam Results

On Wednesday Post 16 students collected their trial exam results in the main hall.

Students will be reflecting on their grades and plan their next steps in Tutor Intervention on Monday. Those seeking support should initially discuss their grades with their teachers. They can also talk to their tutor, who can make a referral to our Academic Coach for advice on revision, time management, study skills, etc. Tutors can also make referrals to well-being support if required.

Year 8 Options Evening

On Monday 30 January we invite students from Year 8 and their parents/carers to a presentation event for Key Stage Four subject options.



This event is designed to give parents and carers the information they need in order to support their children in choosing their GCSE options.

Our GCSE curriculum allows students to choose from a wide range of subjects that they are interested in, but most importantly provides the necessary skills in order to progress onto further study or training.

Whilst all of our subjects allow students to progress onto further study, some A-Level subjects require the subject to have been studied at GCSE level first.

There will be two identical presentations during the event, one at **5.30PM** and the other at **6.15PM**.

Sparx Maths

In Maths this week we have been excited to fully launch Sparx Maths with our students, you may have seen a couple of emails from them.

SPARX MATHS

Sparx Maths is a smart homework platform that gives personalised homework to students about topics we have been covering recently in lessons and some older bits too. A few of our groups have been piloting the website since before Christmas and their feedback has been really positive.

If students find topics difficult, it asks easier questions and if they find it easy then it can start to really challenge them. The site aims to set 30 or 60 minutes of work and learns how quickly individual students work too.



We have found that in the first couple of weeks of the site getting to know our individual students then they might get homework that is too easy or over too quickly. If that happens

then the 'Target' option will generate some harder tasks for them to try and the 'XP Boost' option will give them more maths of the same level. Occasionally some students may get homework that would take too long to complete. If this happens then they are OK to finish the work there, their teacher will be able to see how long it has taken. After three weeks it seems to have got most of our students in the pilot groups figured out.

Year 7 parents, other than parents of those in 7ECK, 7LMA or 7MEM, should have also received an email this week about us implementing our planned setting of maths groups. Check your inbox or contact the Maths department for more details.



Key Stage Three


