Cameras from the England RFU were on hand to record a feature on Emily and interviewed our students who spoke eloquently about their passion for rugby and the inspiration Emily serves for the next generation of women rugby players. A specially made plaque commemorating the naming of the sports hall was later unveiled by Emily in front of students, staff and the England RFU media team. Emily also signed one of her

Cross Country Qualifiers


Massive congratulations to A Level students Isabella W and JayJay R for qualifying for the English Schools Cross-Country Championships in the Senior age group.

On Saturday 4 February, former A Level student, Jacob Lehane, made his English Football League debut as an Assistant Referee in the League Two match between Crewe Alexandra and Grimsby Town.



The appointment was written in the stars with Mr Grest watching his team, Grimsby Town, at Gresty Road stadium whilst also cheering on Jacob. The Assistant Referee began his journey in officiating football whilst at school and used this activity as his assessed practical for his A Level studies back in 2016.

"I am really excited to get started on the Football League after many years of hard work and commitment," said Jacob who was officiating in front of 5,000 fans including the "very loud" Grimsby Town away section.

"Over the last few years of officiating I've been to places like Wrexham and Notts County, giving me the experience ready for Leagues One and Two football.

"In the future I will be officiating on Leagues One and Two as an Assistant Referee and Fourth Official," said Jacob who has made outstanding progress to be promoted to the Football League and we all wish him the very best of luck as his journey continues.

Iceland Geography Trip

Students who will be studying A Level Geography in March 2024 have the opportunity to explore the terrains of Iceland in an upcoming residential trip.



Amongst the highlights will be a tour of the Golden Circle, visits to the Kerid Crater and the waterfalls of Seljalandsfoss and Skogafoss.

The trip will be between Sunday 3—Wednesday 6 March 2024 with a maximum of 20 places available at a cost of £919 per student.

The trip is for students who will be studying AS/A Level Geography in March 2024 and it is therefore essential that **those who attend** will be **current Bosworth Academy students** at the time of the trip. The visit is not compulsory for the A Level Geography exam but will support both the Coasts and Hazards topics which are covered in Year 12 and the Energy and Carbon topic in Year 13. If your child is currently in **Year 11** they **MUST** be predicted at least a **Grade 6 at GCSE**, and have signed up to do Geography A level at Bosworth Academy.

The performance dates are:


- Wednesday 22nd March
