On Saturday 6 May King Charles III will be crowned during his coronation at Westminster Abbey in London.



This momentous occasion will see thousands of people visiting the capital and millions watching at home and across the world.

The previous coronation of Elizabeth II in 1953 was the first to be

televised and Saturday's events will be just as memorable.

This week Year 7 students in Humanities lessons have been discussing the significance of the monarchy, its role and contribution to society,

and debating its future.

Year 7 students Aston C, Florence C, Maddie S and Henry W explored these topics further in student-led assemblies delivered to year groups this week.



The students gave a preview of what is to come by showing a colour video of the late Queen Elizabeth II being crowned in 1953.



Bosworth Academy treated students and staff to a special coronation-themed lunch on Friday by serving trifle and quiche.

The coronation also gives us a chance to come together as a society and think of the 6C values of Citizenship, Collaboration and

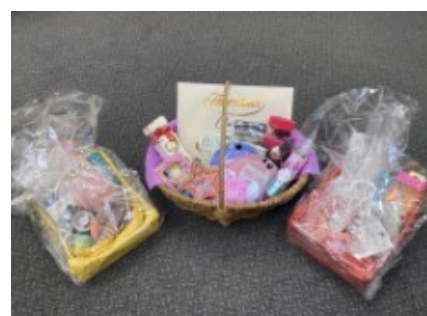
## Year 11 Prom Fundraising

## Electric Car Sponsors

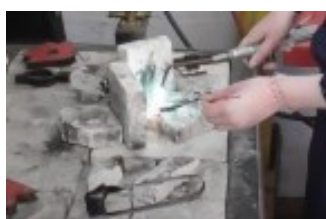
Year 9 Engineering students are asking for your help in raising money to build an electric car and enter it into a race.

## Maths Puzzle of the Week

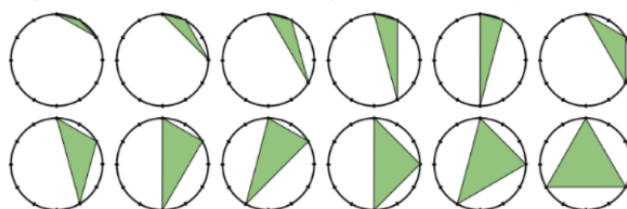
Calling all Bosworth Mathematicians!

This week's Maths puzzle is here and anyone can enter. All you need to do is to write your solution and any working on a piece of paper and place it in the labelled blue boxes outside the Maths office with your name on or email a photo to [hbarrowcliffe@bosworthacademy.org.uk](mailto:hbarrowcliffe@bosworthacademy.org.uk). Below is the answer to last week's conundrum as well as this week's puzzle.

There's a couple of awkward aspects to this puzzle:

- It's easy to accidentally include a rotation or a reflection of a triangle you have already made.
- It's difficult to ensure you haven't missed any triangles.

To make sure I didn't do this I started at 12 o'clock and made all the possible triangles with a side length of '1 hour'. I then did the same for side length '2 hours' then 3 and finally 4.



Another way of looking at this puzzle was to write down how many 'hours long' each of the three sides is. To form a triangle they must all sum to 12. Then we just need all the different sets of three numbers which add to 12. You can see them in the table below, arranged in the same way as the drawings above.

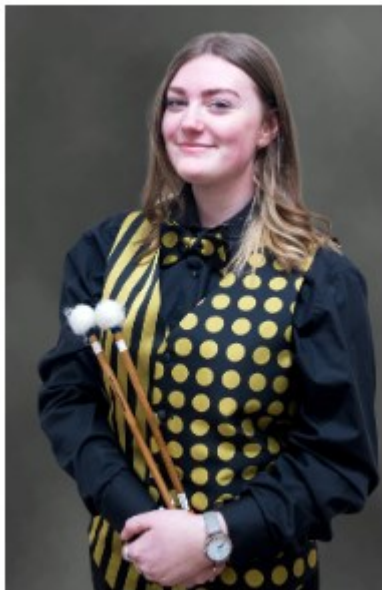

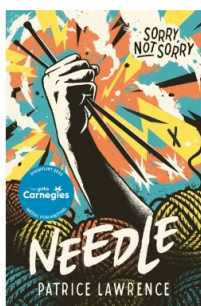


## Book Recommendations

### Key Stage Three

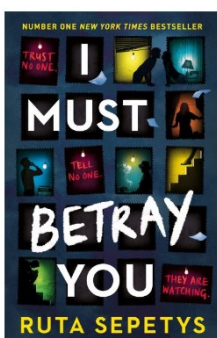


When Charlene loses her temper over a blanket that she hand-knitted, and stabs her foster mum's son in the hand with the knitting needle, she has to deal with the consequences. Charlene is a demon knitter. It's the only thing she enjoys and the only thing she believes she's really good at.

So when her foster mum's son destroys her latest creation, Charlene loses it and stabs him in the hand with her knitting needle. It damages a nerve and she gets sucked into the criminal justice system for assault.

Charlene's not sorry and she's never apologised to anyone in her life. But people keep telling her that if she says sorry, they'll go easier on her. Can she bring herself to say it and not mean it when her freedom's at stake?

### Key Stage Four



A teenager living in 1989 Romania chooses whether to inform on his family to save their lives.

Trapped by an evil dictatorship, will Cristian be forced to betray his family or will he risk everything he loves to resist? Cristian has lived his entire life in the grip of a repressive dictatorship. The country is

governed by fear. When the secret police blackmail him, Cristian has an impossible choice. Save his sick grandfather by informing on his family, or risk his life - and theirs - by resisting? At 17, Cristian dreams of being free but doesn't know where to turn. In this climate of constant suspicion, can he trust his best friend, his girlfriend or even his family?

Closely based on the real events of the Romanian Revolution of 1989, this is a powerful, heart-breaking thriller.

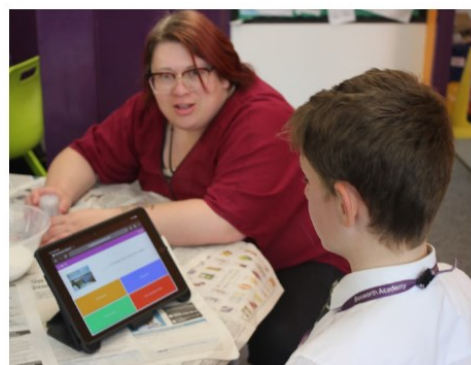
