Year 12 - AS Level/End of Year Results

Please note that in order to return to study in Year 13, students must achieve a minimum of an 'E' grade in their AS or end of year exams/assessment.

If you receive a 'U' grade in any subject, <u>you will not be allowed to continue with that subject in Year 13.</u>

Students who receive a 'U' grade and are left with less than three subjects to study will be required to choose another course at AS if they wish to continue. This will be dependent on grades received at GCSE and availability after the new Year 12 intake have been allocated their subjects.

Please note that continuing with only two full A levels and an AS may impact on your options after finishing A level study.

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Preparation for Exams

As the exam season starts it is crucial that students attend all timetabled lessons, right up until their exam, so that teachers are able to provide additional support and guidance. Students in Year 12 who have an afternoon exam may take the morning off to prepare. This does not apply if they have a morning exam and want the preceding afternoon off, as they will have the evening before for final preparation. Students requesting a morning's absence should email Lesley Brookes in the Post 16 Office to ensure that it is coded.

The same criteria apply to students in Year 13, who should continue attending timetabled lessons until the last exam for each subject.

Once the exam and course are complete, the subject teacher will notify Attendance, the register will be appropriately coded, and students will no longer be required to attend.

Research has shown that having a good breakfast can improve student performance. From Monday, 15 May 2023, we will be providing cereal for students who may not have had the opportunity to have breakfast before their exams. This will be available in Julie Bolton's office from 8.15 am - 8.35 am.

Compass Rules - Last Warning
