It is at this time, that we encourage our Year 10 and Year 12 students to start thinking about their career pathways, ready for the busy Autumn Term when they will need to apply for places elsewhere. Hopefully, many of you will have started attending open days at Universities or colleges. These will continue to be offered in September/October/November.

Year 11 students will need to complete their applications to colleges or apprenticeships by December 2023. Year 12 students will need to have completed their applications by November (ready to be submitted by January), unless they are applying to Oxford/Cambridge or to study Medicine/Veterinary/Dentistry in which case they will need to apply by 15th October. Tutors will signpost students and support with this process. Students are also welcome to request a Careers appointment - just ask your tutor to refer you.










Y12 UCAS Event

The programme is directly aimed at those young people who would benefit from a stepping-stone into the industry.



Applicants will be over the age of 18 and will ideally have some basic theatrical awareness and computer skills. Apprentices will be employed full-time, inclusive of

attending college or training one day per week. Apprentices will begin their placements in Autumn 2023, for a period of either 18-months or 2-years, depending on the discipline. Alongside funding the apprentice's salary and contributing toward travel expenses, The Mackintosh Foundation is funding in -person meetings of the full cohort during the programme, as well as hosting regular online calls for the apprentices to link up with industry professionals to expose them to the industry at large.
