Of course this has been a challenging week, with two days of industrial action by NEU meaning children in some year groups have had to complete learning at home. I wish to thank parents and carers for your support and understanding as I know Wednesday and Friday will have been disruptive to yourselves and your own work commitments.

The attendance of students in school was good with over 93% of Year 7 being present, higher than the national average on a 'normal' school day. I'm pleased to share that students have made the most of any time they have had in school and worked well.

On Tuesday we welcomed our new Year 6 students for their induction. It was fantastic to see how much they enjoyed their first day in school. Many may have been anxious initially, however by the end of the day they were looking forward to starting Bosworth Academy after the summer holiday on Tuesday 29th August 2023.



Our Colours Award Evening on Thursday evening was fantastically well attended. I apologise to those parents who ended up standing at the back during the Key Stage 3 celebration. We didn't expect to have so many family members wanting to share in the success of their children. As the final week of term approaches it is important to remember that learning remains our key focus and our curriculum continues until the final lesson of the week on Thursday 13th July. The week will include some celebratory assemblies and a rewards event for students to recognise successes. On Monday it will be our annual Sports Day at Saffron Lane Athletics Stadium, this is always an exciting day with both competitive and fun events.

Our students learn so much from our Sports Day. As **Sebastian Coe**, middle-distance runner and President of World Athletics said, "Sport


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Year 6 Induction Day

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Maths Puzzle of the Week

Last Week's Answer: 13


Some puzzlers over a certain age may have noticed that Paula is almost making chocolate Tetris pieces (from the classic 80s computer game). Mathematically these are called tetrominoes (dominoes are made from 2 squares, triominoes from 3 and tetrominoes from 4). There are 7 possible tetrominoes (including reflections). They are all shown below.



However, Paula is using rectangles so she can make two versions of most of the pieces. One with the rectangles vertical and one with them horizontal.



The exception is the 'square' piece which ends up the same whichever way round the rectangular chunks are.



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Sports Day Update

As we approach Sports Day at Saffron Lane Athletics Stadium on Monday 10th July we wanted to give you some more details about the day and what your child needs to bring.

Students must come to the school in their school PE kit. There will be no need to bring their uniform with them. They will need to check the weather and bring appropriate clothing to keep them warm and/or dry so please bring a waterproof coat and jumper. Please note they will be expected to wear school PE kit and anyone wearing unsuitable clothing will be expected to borrow PE kit from the school. If the weather is hot and sunny please provide your child with suntan lotion. We also advise wearing a cap.

Students will be at Saffron Lane for the vast majority of the day and will not be able to purchase lunch in the normal way at the school canteen.

Students should make sure they bring enough food and drink with them from home. Students who normally have free school meals will be given a packed lunch by the school in the morning. Some snacks and drinks will be available to purchase at Saffron Lane. Students will need to bring some money to make these purchases. Please also ensure your child brings enough fluids to last the whole day.

The nature of the day means that students belongings may be unattended for periods of time. Please ensure all clothing is named and we would encourage students to leave valuables at home. Parents will be allowed to spectate the event from 10.00am onwards and a separate seating area will be provided for your viewing pleasure. Please note students will be expected to travel to and from Bosworth as we have tutor interventions planned that all students will need to be part of.

We are still taking £5 contributions via sQuid to contribute to the costs of the event. Tutor groups are also continuing their fundraising with total raised towards goal shown below.

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iPad Use

Our aim at Bosworth Academy is to plan and deliver lessons that are exciting, interactive and encourage high levels of critical thinking as this will result in greater progress. In order for all our students to achieve, it is essential that they come to the lessons equipped for learning.



As you are aware, in order to facilitate an excellent learning experience, and to support students to engage with all classroom activities, students have been given an iPad: a valuable resource that can be a powerful learning tool. Students are required to bring a fully charged iPad to school. Equipment will be checked by form tutors each morning, as we are keen to ensure that students have everything they need to fully participate in lessons.

Many lessons are designed around the use of technology. Without an iPad, students will be unable to fully participate in the learning and could be hindered in developing the technological skill set required for their futures in the workplace. To address this, from the new academic year, students who forget to bring an iPad to school, bring an iPad to school that is not charged or have an iPad being repaired by the IT Department, will be allowed to borrow a 'loan iPad' from the school.

In exchange for a loan iPad, students will be asked to leave their mobile phone as a security deposit. Due to the expense of providing additional iPads, we are keen to ensure that these are well looked after and returned at the end of the school day, which is why we are asking students to exchange a high value possession. Students can collect their mobile phones at the end of the day when they return their iPad.

We recognise that for some students, being without a mobile phone during the school day will be an inconvenience, but we hope that students will make choices that prioritise their learning to ensure that they can fully achieve their potential. Please contact the school if you have any queries.

WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

A video-sharing platform designed as an alternative to YouTube, Rumble is the epitome of a 'slow burner' in digital circles: it was initially launched in 2013, but it's only in the last two or three years that it's begun to gain serious traction. Much of Rumble's recent growth has stemmed from its association with Truth Social, the platform founded by former US President Donald Trump. Rumble's content frequently reflects some intense political viewpoints; this can often affect the way it approaches topics and has occasionally caused the platform to venture into controversial territory.

POLITICAL AFFILIATIONS

The company which developed Rumble is also responsible for hosting Truth Social, the often contentious news and social network founded by Donald Trump. Indeed, Rumble's content often reflects the ideas of one group of US voters, who have embraced it as an alternative to more mainstream social media. Many parents may feel that such an overtly political platform isn't suitable for young people.

PROVOCATIVE CONTENT

Rumble prides itself on championing free speech, with its CEO declaring the platform "immune to cancel culture". Many of Rumble's highest-profile content creators – such as Andrew Tate and Russell Brand – are well known for sharing opinions which are often described as extreme. While adults might be equipped to treat this content objectively, much of it may not be appropriate for a young audience.

INAPPROPRIATE MATERIAL

In very simple terms, Rumble works a little like YouTube but with far fewer censors and restrictions being applied to its content. If age-inappropriate material or potentially harmful misinformation is trending on the platform and being shared among more mature users, there's a distinct possibility that Rumble's algorithm may also recommend that content to a child.

CONTROVERSIAL FIGURES

Many of Rumble's best-known accounts are owned by individuals who have previously been banned from other social media platforms. There could, of course, be a variety of reasons behind this – but it almost certainly increases the chances of your child coming across content on Rumble which probably wouldn't be deemed acceptable on other similar platforms.

SENSITIVE TOPICS

In recent months, some prominent Rumble influencers have expressed uncompromising views on sensitive subjects such as gun control, abortion, LGBTQ issues and more. With many Rumble accounts tending to display a noticeable political bias, the concern would be that young people using the platform may not always be presented with an impartial perspective on these important and complex topics.

THE ALTERNATIVE VIEW

Advice for Parents & Carers

TALK ABOUT POLITICS

Rumble does have a team of moderators, but the nature of the platform means that some permitted content is likely to be controversial and highly subjective. That possibility might make many parents uncomfortable – but if your child does view (or hear about) something provocative on Rumble, it can still provide a useful opportunity to discuss politics at home in a safe, relaxed environment.

RESEARCH ALTERNATIVES

No video-sharing platform is totally free from potentially harmful content, of course – but the number of prominent account holders on Rumble whose output has previously been banned from similar services is certainly a cause for concern. If your child is becoming interested in influencer culture or politics specifically, you could perhaps research more family-friendly platforms together.

CHECK UP REGULARLY

Like any video-sharing platform, there's a chance that Rumble might suggest inappropriate content for your child. There may be an algorithm issue – or it could be that the recommendations are based on videos they've previously viewed. If your child uses Rumble, you might consider a chat with them about which accounts they follow and what type of content is suitable for their age.

DISCUSS IMPARTIALITY

Many prominent Rumble accounts wear their political leanings firmly on their sleeves. As a result, it can be tricky for impressionable young people to appreciate both sides of any given debate. If your child is old enough to use Rumble, you may feel that a discussion of some things they've seen might be prudent – if so, be prepared for some complex (and possibly lengthy) conversations!


Key Stage Three
