Form to meet our French counterparts.



"We had conversations in French and English and there were presentations from both sides. On a personal level I was delighted to practise my Norwegian with another Norwegian student as well! We did some team building activities and then left to eat lunch in McDonald's (very French I know). After that we did a tour of Paris, starting with the Louvre, which was very stunning. We then walked along the Champs Elysées to the Arc de Triomphe, stopping at a crepe stool and a French market en route.

"I saw lots of low planes which was exciting and

then we went to the Eiffel Tower. We were very lucky to see it lit up as the sun had gone down and we took lots of photos. We spent a long time there so that by the time we



got back to the hotel my feet were very sore (as were everyone else's), then we ate dinner and chilled for the evening, ready for another busy day the day after."

Students were then given a live demonstration of cutting someone out of a car with Year 12 student, Jack B, being a willing volunteer. We thank Leicestershire Police Fire and Rescue for an impactful visit and to the students who listened intently.









### **Riders Open Courts**

Leicester Riders BBL team officially opened Bosworth Academy's outdoor basketball courts on Monday with Head Coach Rob Paternostro hailing the outdoor courts as the "best" he has seen in over 20 years of coaching in the UK.



Paternostro was also impressed with the basketball skills of around 100 Bosworth Academy students who played mini games with the Riders players during the event.

Before shooting hoops, the two outdoor basketball courts were unveiled in a ceremony with words

"It was a great experience as a whole. Having the team pull up to the school was a great experience to have," said Elyas. "The courts are

exceptional, the best I've played on. It was surprising to see when they were first completed because it's not something you see in England often.

"Going one-on-one with a professional Riders player was thrilling. Playing against a professional is a once in a lifetime experience, and managing to block his shot it was so much better. Overall, a great experience," added Elyas.

#### **BBC Radio Reporter Visits**

On Monday we were delighted to welcome back former Bosworth student Mike Williams whose career in broadcasting has seen him become the sports correspondent on the BBC Radio 2 Zoe Ball Breakfast Show.



Mike's fascination with radio was developed whilst he was at Bosworth and he returned to give a session on the radio industry with our GCSE and A Level Media students.



Having discussed the BBC services, which range from TV, radio and online, Mike then gave the Year 12 students a task in writing scripts for a radio two-way conversation on topical subjects.

The students' great creative flair was shown in writing scripts which were then read aloud with Mike, who was impressed with the skills shown.
