Revision Academy

As part of our programme of preparing students for their GCSE and A Level examinations, we are working with your son/daughter to support their progress in all subjects.

We aim to maximise all opportunities to support students in achieving their target grades and support them in securing their options for further education and career prospects.

To support students during the February half term, Bosworth Academy is offering a range of revision opportunities on Monday 19th to Friday 23rd February. We would appreciate it if you could encourage your son/daughter to attend these sessions and point out their importance in the lead up to the GCSE/ ALevel examinations.

There are various sessions running each day. Payment for the session is through the SQuid app on a first come, first serve basis. Places will be in demand and the deadline for booking is 9th February. Each two hour session costs £3 which covers resources and exam booklets.

Sessions can be cancelled and refunded with prior notice. The money will be refunded to your child's sQuid "trips/offers" purse. You can transfer the money to your child's catering account using the app or keep it in the trips/offers purse for future Revision Academies/resources/trips. If your child is in receipt of Free School Meals the money will be refunded to the SQuid account after half term. Refer to the timetable below for sessions that are running and the rooms where they are taking place. Please make a note of the sessions you have signed up for.

Students will need to make their own transport arrangements for getting to and from the Academy. Students are also expected to bring their own lunch. Students are not required to wear uniform during revision academy.

In previous years, over 100 students have attended our revision programme and found the experience to be extremely rewarding. I hope that you agree that this is an opportunity not to be missed and a great way to kick start revision if this still hasn't begun.

Maximise Your Potential

Maths Puzzle of the Week

Last Week's Answer: 63

Setting out your working clearly can be SO useful in solving all sorts of problems. In this instance the puzzle can be solved easily without any algebra or clever tricks by just working backwards. Below I've made a flow chart illustrating the story from the question.

Starting -32 x2 -32 x2

Every time Karen picks 32 raspberries we subtract 32 and then when the raspberries double we multiply by two. To solve the puzzle we need to find the number of starting raspberries, so we can work in the opposite direction from the only number we know (which is zero).

To work backwards we can ireverse the arrows and do the opposite of each operation. This is called the *inverse* in mathematics. The table

below shows the *inverse* of each operation. Finally, we just need to fill in all the blanks, starting from the right, to find out the starting number of raspberries: **63**.



This week's puzzle: How Many Students?

Vicky ran a knitting course and gave her students some wool. Each student was given three different colours of wool.

Each ball of red wool was shared between 2 students.

Each ball of wool of blue wool was shared between 3 students.

Each ball of green wool was shared between 4 students.

In total, Vicky used 26 balls of wool and there was no wool left over.

How many students did Vicky have on her course?

Extension: How many students would there be if she used 156 balls of wool?

If she also shared balls of yellow wool between 6 students, what would be a good number of balls of wool for her to buy?

Science Club Concrete

At Science Club this week Year 8 made concrete. Each student made it using a different ratio of cement, sand and aggregate. At the next session we are going to test the concrete and see which mixture is the strongest.



WHAT ARE THE RISKS?

MyLOL is a free social networking and dating site aimed at teens. Profiles can publicly display users' images and information, including sexual orientation and personal interests. The service bills itself as "the number one teen dating website in the world", claiming to have more than a million users globally. Despite its popularity, the MyLOL app is no longer available from Google Play or the App Store, although the site is still active. In some countries, police forces and schools have previously warned parents about "sinister predators" and "inappropriate activities" on the site.

Remind them i the risks of sharing intimate images and information with strangers ad emphasise that most people don't realise they're being 'catfished' ntil it's too late – it really isn't wise for a young person to meet up with smeane they've only spoken to online.

RESTRICT IN-APP SPENDING

If your child has access to a bank card or other payment method, they may be enticed into signing up for MyLOL's premium features. Having their profile boosted and receiving more attention could be especially tempting if their friends also use the site. You could consider altering the device's settings to disable internet purchases, or at the very least kee an eye on their online spending.

-Before your child begins using a service such as MyLOL, it's important that they understand the potential pitfalls of giving out their personal data on this type of platform. Explain to them, for example, that they shouldn't divulge any personally identifying information to people wh identifying information to people who they quite convincing when attempting to steal

SET UP LOCATION ALERTS

If you're worried that your child may be planning to meet up with someone they've met on MyLOL, you could consider utilising GPS or WiFi location tracking technology to follow their whereabouts in real time. You can even set up a virtual boundary or 'fence' and opt to receive an alert to your phone if your child enters or exits a specified area.






superhero graphic with good illustrations and entertaining dialogue.



School Catering Price Rise

You will be aware that food prices have risen sharply in recent years which has put pressures on both caterers and families.

At Bosworth Academy we have always aimed to keep the service at the lower end of reasonable costs, but unfortunately we now have to raise the cost of the hot or cold



school meal deal to £3, still representing good value for money. The price rise will be introduced following the half term break on Monday 26th February 2024.

As part of the deal students can have a hot main meal and a drink OR a main meal and a pudding. Please encourage your child to bring a water bottle for school and opt to have a main meal and a pudding instead of a drink as this is far better value for your money and more filling for your child. Students may also choose the cold canteen meal deal consisting of a sandwich, baguette, pasta pot or wrap with crisps or popcorn and a drink (carton or water).

Alongside the rise in cost of the meal deal there will be small rises in the cost of other items on offer.

We appreciate that a lot of families are experiencing increased pressure with the cost of living at the moment and we would like you to remember that if you do not already receive free school meals, you may be eligible. Follow this link to see if you are eligible and then send your completed form to the address shown at the end. For families who are struggling we also now have a school pantry with help from MCKS Charity. The service is open to anyone, supporting the Bosworth Academy community, offering pantry essentials and toiletries. Please email pupilpremium@bosworthacademy.org.uk if you would like to access the service and we can arrange a suitable time for you or your child to visit.
