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Sports Day 2024


Our annual Bosworth Academy Sports Day is fast approaching. This important event in the Summer Term calendar is an inclusive event offering a variety of activities to suit students of all abilities and interests. We believe it is an opportunity for all students to have a personal best aspirational attitude, demonstrate important social skills as well as showing courage. All of these values are part of the 6C framework that we buy into at Bosworth both in and out of the classroom. As in previous years we will be holding the Sports Day at Saffron Lane Athletics Stadium during school time on Monday 1st July. Awards will be presented for event winners by tutor group and to individuals who demonstrate many of the 6Cs (character, collaboration, creativity, citizenship, communication, critical thinking). Events will range from traditional track and field events along with non-traditional events such as wellie-wanging and swamp stomping.

Sports Day will always be part of the school calendar but in order that students can experience it in a stadium, rather than on our school field, we are asking parents and carers to make a contribution of £5 via sQuid. Exam Preparation — Effective Revision Strategies


Students at Bosworth Academy are developing 'The Core Four' - strategies designed to improve study skills for effective revision.







child, discuss their work in school and how they can implement the strategies at home in preparation for end of topic tests and exams.



Favela Research Project

On Thursday our Year 12 students began their participation in a PhD research programme into the Brazilian Favela community by Oxford Brookes University.



The students began the programme by answering an online survey on their understanding of the Favela before watching a video which gave context on the history of the community which originated on the hillside of Rio de Janeiro in the late 19th century. This video was able to challenge the misconceptions that people may have about the community.



After completing this task the students were introduced to Professor Fabian Frenzel, Oxford Brookes University, and his research team via video link. The research project will continue for the next two weeks where students will have a virtual tour of the Rio Favela by tour guides with the project allowing students to learn about another culture and develop their Citizenship 6C value.






Maths Puzzle of the Week

How much does a fish weigh if its tail weighs 4kg, its head weighs as much as its tail and half its body and its body weighs as much as it head and tail together?




Answer: 32kg h=4+1/2b (1) b=h+4 (2) Substituting (2) into (1) Gives h=4+1/2 (h+4) Hence 1/2h=6 Therefore h= 12 and b = 16

Total weight = 12+16+4=32kg


Book Recommendations


