

School Pickup

Thank you for your ongoing cooperation as we continue to improve the pick-up process and alleviate traffic congestion around the school. We would like to take this opportunity to reiterate some key points to ensure a smoother, safer experience for all.

The safety of students and visitors to Bosworth Academy is of paramount importance and we therefore have a strict **5mph speed limit** around the site to reduce the risks of accidents happening.

We kindly remind you to plan your pick-up for after 15:20, once the school buses have departed. This not only reduces congestion but can also significantly shortens your waiting time. Both the top and bottom gates are available for pick-up, so please use either to help distribute traffic more evenly and relieve pressure on surrounding roads. Please note that staff will temporarily hold cars to allow the safe departure of buses, and we ask for your patience and respect during this process.

We would also like to stress the importance of respecting local residents. Please avoid blocking driveways or parking in front of homes, as this can cause unnecessary inconvenience and frustration. In addition, we kindly ask that you do not stop in the school's entrance or exit zones, which must remain clear for the safe and efficient flow of traffic.

Finally, we are working closely with police to address inappropriate driving behaviour near the school. The safety of our students and the local community is our top priority, and we are taking proactive measures to ensure that all drivers follow safe and courteous road practices. 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

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Exam Preparation — Effective Revision Strategies


Students at Bosworth Academy are developing 'The Core Four' - strategies designed to improve study skills for effective revision.






