#### Sports Day



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## **Year 12 Enterprise Day**


Monday saw our Year 12 students take part in this year's Enterprise Day —a fun, fast-paced event inspired by Dragons' Den.

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## **Bosworth Academy PE Kit**

For PE, students are able to wear a plain black T-shirt as their PE top. We are also going to allow sports T-shirts with small logos. The logo must be discreet. Students may continue to wear their black Bosworth Academy branded polo shirt next year also.

#### **PE Footwear**

The reason for requiring specialist footwear is due to having a large sum of money invested in our PE facilities and the incorrect footwear can lead to early wear and tear. 'Normal' trainers flatten the surface and reduce the lifespan and 'bladed football boots' give players too much grip on the rubber crumb surface which can lead to ripping the carpet or serious injury to the player wearing the boot.


The footwear will be required at lunch and break should students be wishing to access the Dome or 3G pitch.

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


#### Maths Puzzle of the Week

Last week's puzzle: Arthimetic Test

On four tests, each marked out of 100, my average mark was 85

What is the lowest mark I could have scored on any test?



40

I achieved an average of 85 on the four tests. Hence, I obtained a total of  $4 \times 85 = 340$  marks for these tests. The lowest possible mark on one of these tests must be combined with the highest possible mark of 100 on the other three tests. This means that my mark on the fourth test would be  $340 - 3 \times 100 = 340 - 300 = 40$ .

Hence the lowest mark I could have scored on any one test is 40.



Shireen's dream come true! Because winning will not only mean


prize money, but it will also bring some muchneeded attention to You Drive Me Glazy, her parents' beloved donut shop.
