

Next on my list:



Reading for Pleasure at Home


It's great to hear about all the reading that goes on at home. I love chatting to children about their favourite books and what they're reading!

Sometimes it can be hard to decide what to read next. If you're anything like me, you want to read so many! Here are some tips to help you choose a story that you'll love!




Fantastic Facts!


Plenty of children like to get lost in facts just as much or more than they like getting lost in a story. Below are some non-fiction recommendations.
