<u>Expenditure</u>

- 1. Boldon Cluster fee including 9 competitions and coach support taking P.E sessions in dance **(£1,600**)
- 2. South Tyneside School Sport Level Agreement (3 years entry) which incorporates:
- Staff CPD including 4 Developing High Quality P.E Courses and 4 Sport Specific Courses for teaching staff
- Primary Playground Leaders Course for Lunchtime Staff
- 2 Twilight sessions tailored to our school
- 12 hours coaching to use in school
- 40% discount on additional coaching to use in extra-curricular or curriculum time
- Over 20 competitions across KS2 to compete in.
- 3 Flagship sport festivals (gymnastics, dance and cheerleading) and 3 mass participation events for full year groups.
- Outdoor adventure festivals for two year groups.
- Beach Day competitions for a year group (£5995)

3. Specialist delivery from outstanding providers in tennis and dance throughout KS2 (£950)

4. Two PE Apprentices to lead our active playtimes and improve our sporting provision across the whole school day **(£11,674)**

4. Sports equipment to further enhance our PE provision and sporting opportunities including boccia set, netball posts, netballs, basketballs, play leader equipment and clothing and footballs (**£723**)

5. Transport to sporting competitions (£280)

- Monitor the success of Peat Rigg Residential Centre, North Yorkshire. This replaced our long term residential opportunity at Gibside National which was stopped following
- Consider extending our residential experience opportunities to Year 4.
