




| <h3>NURSERY</h3> <p>Having had a doll's house donated, Nursery have really enjoyed their project of building and designing their own rooms for it. They have come up with themed rooms, such as; a butterfly kitchen, a superhero room, a dinosaur room and a fairy land. The children have also been studying the text, <i>The Hungry Caterpillar</i>. In addition to this, they have had their own live caterpillars in the Nursery and have loved watching them develop into their chrysalis and then into butterflies.</p>  | <h3>YEAR ONE</h3> <p>Year 1 have enjoyed reading their text <i>The snail and the whale</i>. They have been writing their own stories following the style of Julia Donaldson, the author.
