Year 3 and 4 Project

Project Description

We have got a very exciting project this half term in Gefen and Rimon, delving back into time to look at the stone age! We will be exploring different aspects of life during this period including how the stone age people lived, looking at the tools they used, the jewellery and clothes they wore and the animals that were alive during this time. The children will be learning these facts through fun interactive and sensory activities with the children designing and creating many of the stone age objects. We will also be looking at how the stone age people lived through different story books, pictures and cave paintings. They will be able to test out many of the life skills of stone age people when we visit The Chiltern Open Air Museum and take part in all their stone age work shop activities. In our history lesson we will also be learning about the role of an archaeologist and the famous stone site of Skara Brae in Scotland. Our exhibition at the end of the project will showcase all their amazing work culminating in a fashion show and cave painting workshop!
