With the summer break coming up, what better time to start working on bike riding skills. Bike riding encompasses many gross motor skills, including balance, bilateral coordination, postural strength, lower limb strength and core strength. Before starting to ride two-wheeler bicycles we suggest practising riding tricycles and scooters, which help children to learn these essential skills. We recommend breaking down the task in a manner where you are helping your child learn to balance as a distinct skill separate from learning to pedal.
