It is tempting to ask our children lots of questions when they get home from school, of course, we want to know everything about their day! However, this can cause pressure when they're tired after a long day, and frustration if they can't express themselves. Try offering opportunities to share without pressure e.g. "Do you want to speak about your day? No? Okay, if you want to speak later I'm here to listen". If they want to share, you could try to ask a less open-ended question that requires less cognitive energy and expressive language e.g. "Did you play with xxxx?" or give choices "Was maths or literacy your favourite today?". Another top tip is not to ask questions straight after school, and wait until your child has had a snack and a chance to decompress from the day.
