Therapy Corner

What zone are you in ? 'Zones of Regulation' is something we use daily at Gesher, possibly on an hourly basis! The Zones of Regulation is a resource used to teach social, emotional and sensory regulation. The zones teach children to understand their emotions, explore strategies as well as the impact of their zones on other people. It's important to remember that there are no 'bad' zones. The zones are a safe way to allow children to explore, learn and discuss their emotions and sensory needs. Praise can be given to children in the green zone (calm, focused etc), children in the blue zone (sad, tired, sick etc) can be offered support and children in the yellow (anxious, silly etc) and red zone (anger, panic etc) can be given the tools to regulate themselves, returning to the green zone. Zones of Regulation resources are available upon request for use at home.
