**LEGO Therapy** is a speech and language intervention that works closely with students to support their language development, prepositional vocabulary, turn-taking, resilience, and overall communication with their peers. There are 3 key roles: Engineer: Has the booklet, gives the supplier descriptions of what pieces to take out, and instructs the builder where to place the LEGO. Supplier: Has all the LEGO pieces, listens to the engineer's description of the LEGO build, and passes the correct pieces to the builder Builder: Listens to the instructions from the engineer and places the LEGO pieces to create the build. If your child enjoys playing with LEGO, you can try this twist at home!

Last week the students celebrated Shavuot (Receiving the Torah festival) by making chocolate fruit cheesecake ice lollies and emulating Moshe climbing up Mount Sinai to receive the 10 commandments by climbing an 8.5m high rock-climbing wall that was brought into school.
