Some of the older students helped facilitate the experiences for the younger ones by supporting them during various activities. The students asked many questions and had the chance to try and see which of the many options might be a fit for them one day. We're very grateful to Miss Jodi and Mr Aymane who organised and ran this fantastic day and to our volunteers who brought a wealth of experience to our school.
