Kodesh Corner

Last Shabbat, synagogues started the second book of the Torah. The Hebrew names of the 5 books of the Torah reflect their main themes: 1) Bereishit talks about 'creation', 3) Vayikra of the High priests being 'called' to holiness, 4) Bamidbar is about the 40 years 'in the desert', and 5) Devarim of Moshe's final 'words'. However, the second book, Shemot, contains the story of slavery in Egypt, the Exodus, the 10 plagues, splitting of the sea, and the giving of the Torah. There are so many names that could be given to this book which reflect these key themes, yet it is called Shemot referring to the 'names' of the people who went to Egypt. Why are 'names' more important than the major events that happened?

An idea is that a name represents who a person is and where one comes from. Even during the difficulties of being slaves in Egypt, the Israelites kept their names, holding on to their identity, heritage and values of those people who went down to Egypt. Our sages teach that this was one of the reasons they were freed. The book of Shemot reminds us that before, during and after these miracles and great events, it is strong character and a clear sense-of-self that matters most. As we begin this term, we look forward to not only seeing our students grow and succeed in their learning, but just as importantly, see them positively develop and strengthen their character, thereby carrying their "name" and core values with confidence wherever life takes them.
