Well done to all our daily readers — keep it up!



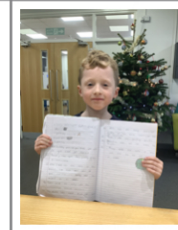
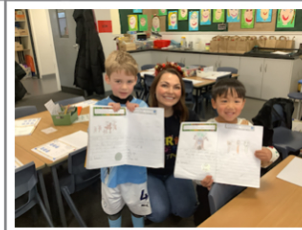
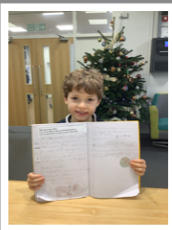
FOOD WASTE!
