## Core Substantive Knowledge

### Belonging to a Community

Children learn:

- To understand what prejudice means
- To differentiate between prejudice and discrimination
- To understand how to recognise acts of discrimination
- To identify strategies to safely respond to and challenge discrimination
- To recognise stereotypes in different contexts and the influence they have on attitudes and understanding of different groups
- To understand how stereotypes are perpetuated and how to challenge this

## Key Vocabulary

Stereotype, visible difference, unique, prejudice, discrimination, influence, extremism, negative

## Key Questions

- How are we all different and why can this be problematic?
- What is the difference between prejudice and discrimination?
- How would I manage negative influences?

### Media Literacy and Digital Resilience

Children learn:

- To recognise the benefits of safe internet use e.g. learning, connecting and communicating
- To understand how and why images online might be manipulated, altered, or faked
- To recognise when images might have been altered
- To understand why people choose to communicate through social media and some of the risks and challenges of doing so
- To understand that social media sites have age restrictions and regulations for use
- To understand the reasons why some media and online content is not appropriate for children
- To understand how online content can be designed to manipulate people's emotions and encourage them to read or share things
- To understand about sharing things online, including rules and laws relating to this

<p><b>Money and Work</b></p> <p>Children learn:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• To learn about the role that money plays in people's lives, attitudes towards it and what influences decisions about money</li> <li>• To understand value for money and how to judge if something is value for money</li> <li>• To understand how companies encourage customers to buy things and why it is important to be a critical consumer</li> <li>• To understand how having or not having money can impact on a person's emotions, health and wellbeing</li> <li>• To recognise the common risks associated with money, including debt, fraud and gambling</li> <li>• To understand how money can be gained or lost e.g. stolen, through scams or gambling and how these put people at financial risk</li> <li>• To understand how to get help if they are concerned about gambling or other financial risks</li> </ul>	<p>Emotional wellbeing, spending, impact, critical, consumer, value, risk, influence, gambling, debt</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• How do we feel when we spend?</li> <li>• How do I manage my spending choices?</li> <li>• What do I need to be aware of with regards to money?</li> </ul>
