SCHOOL CAR PARK

Recently we have had a number of concerns regarding parking along Altrincham Road, in the staff car park and at the top end of Gorseley Road. On numerous occasions there are incidents of parents parking on double yellow lines, partially across driveways and blocking the school car park. This is not acceptable and creates significant congestion and a serious health and safety risk for our children and community. Unfortunately, despite our best endeavours there are still a minority of families who ignore our requests and continue to cause chaos for everyone else.

This morning alone there were a number of cars blocking the staff car park, and a member of our staff had to stop the traffic on Altrincham Road to enable everyone to exit safely. This is no longer an acceptable situation and we have therefore made the decision that the staff car park will no longer be open to parents with the exception of the following:

- blue badge holders
- children with mobility issues
- dropping off at Kids Club before 8am and collecting from Kids Club after 4.30pm
- children attending appointments or going home poorly during the school day.

To support these changes the main gate to the staff car park will be locked at certain times with access on foot through the small gate next to the post box.

Please do not use the staff car park when collecting from extra-curricular clubs, or arriving late to drop off or collect your child. Please park on the road and walk in the short distance.

Again, we want to reiterate the number of incidents of dangerous parking on the adjacent roads and will continue to report these to the local police and parking enforcement officers.

Thank you for your cooperation with all of this.
