# Children and Young people across Newcastle are set to enjoy their "Best Summer Ever" thanks to a partnership between Newcastle City Council and StreetGames.



NUFC Foundation host a football session

Best Summer Ever is an amazing million-pound programme of events, activities, sports and healthy eating available to all children and young people across Newcastle throughout the school summer holidays.

The project will feature projects from over 70 different partners, including the Newcastle United Foundation, Hat-Trick and Bollywood Dancing as well as nutritional advice and healthy food provided by Fair Share.

£1.1 million pound funding to develop the project came from a Department for Education grant aimed at reducing the number of young people who experience "holiday hunger", however Newcastle's offer is open to all young people – aged 5 – 16 – in the city and every project is completely free.

The events will kick off on July 22 and be held at over 140 different venues across Newcastle, including schools, sports clubs, libraries and parks. Some specific projects may even include trips out of the city – to the seaside, museums and visiting Dippy the Dinosaur.

Best Summer Ever will also tie into other major projects aimed at young people in Newcastle, including the Summer Reading Challenge at Newcastle's Libraries and the City of Dreams project which aims to get more children involved in the arts, culture and museums. This will help to create a fully inclusive offer with something for absolutely everyone to enjoy.

The project was officially launched at Bridgewater Community Primary School, in Newcastle's West End, where pupils enjoyed a sample of some of the activities that will be on offer this summer, including football skills from the NUFC Foundation, dodgeball with Hat-Trick and Bollywood Dancing. There was also healthy eating advice and free fruit on offer, provided by Fair Share.

Councillor Clare Penny-Evans, cabinet member for communities with Newcastle City Council said:

"I am pleased to officially launch Newcastle's Best Summer Ever.

"This million-pound programme of events will have around 70 different projects across Newcastle taking part, showcasing a variety of activities, sporting events, design and crafts, dance, performing arts and healthy eating.

"The offer is open to all children and young people in the city and we are creating a programme that will suit everyone's tastes and be fully inclusive – everyone taking part will get lunch and nutritional advice from our team of experts to keep them fuelled up during their chosen activities.

"Years of government-led austerity have had a real impact on the region and summer holidays can be challenging times for families. Unfortunately, as a result, many young people see the amount of physical activity they take part in reduce over the break and it is important we provide opportunities for children to be active, healthy and happy all year round.

"I hope everyone, from all communities and backgrounds, will really get on board and be a part of Newcastle's Best Summer Ever and enjoy this fantastic opportunity."

Jane Ashworth, CEO of StreetGames, said: "By securing this funding from the Department for Education we intend to provide young people with access to great activities, nutritious meals and fun summertime experiences.

"In working with Newcastle City Council, as well as hundreds of community organisations, we have developed an exciting, engaging and educational programme of events.

"Together, we will support more young people, families and communities to experience their best summer ever!"

It is estimated that across Newcastle over 10,000 young people access free school meals, an important source of energy and nutrition during the school term. However, school holiday periods can lead to increased pressure on families without school meals, breakfast clubs or after school clubs, this additional pressure can increase the likelihood of holiday hunger.

There is also evidence to show that many pupils reduce the amount of physical activity they enjoy over the holidays, this reduction can be 18 times higher in some of the most deprived wards in Newcastle.

The Best Summer Ever will engage with children across the city; evidence shows that 16 days of activity throughout the holidays is the perfect amount to ensure they remain health and happy.

The programme will be delivered in partnership between Newcastle City Council, Active Newcastle and StreetGames, who successfully delivered a pilot of the programmed in summer 2018.

### **FAS Team**







Our Family Advice and Support team (FAS) work with parents and carers of disabled children and young people up to the age of 25 years to provide co-ordinated support.

What the Family Advice and Support Team can do for you:

### **Information Advice and Support**

The team provides information and advice on a range of issues, from helping you to navigate your way around the Local Offer, connecting you with other services, to offering advice on a range of specific issues such as transport, holidays, activities and planning for adulthood.

We can offer you practical information and advice, appropriate to your circumstances and we work across all agencies such as education, social care, health, benefits, leisure and voluntary services.

We can support you in meetings in school and help with Parental Views in the Education Health & Care Plan Assessment process. Our Information Advice and Guidance service will work with you to see if you need more in depth support such as supporting you at Early Help meetings.

### In Depth Casework

We can offer in depth advice and support for parents/carers tailored to your individual family's needs, working with other agencies towards positive outcomes for your family. This support is usually more longer term, and is not time limited, but considers your family's situation.

For example we can help families prepare for meetings so that the views of parents, children and young people are heard.

### **Grant Funding Applications**

We can provide help and guidance on completing grant funding application forms for items or activities which will help your family or child/young person. (This is often dependent on family income).

### **Coffee Morning / Drop ins**

Come and meet other parent/carers and find out what works for them. Speak to our team face to face to help you get information relevant to your family.

### **Social Media**

Our social media allows you to keep up to date with news and local activities for you and your family. You can connect with other parents/carers to help each other.

### Workshops / Training

We run workshops and events based on feedback from parents on a variety of topics including "How to use Newcastle Local Offer website" and "Preparing for Adulthood" - preparing parents for when their young person moves from children's to adult services.

#### Art Academy for 7-10 year olds

### 23 July until 25 July; 30 July until 1 Aug; 13 Aug until 15 Aug; 20 Aug until 22 Aug


## Newcastle Airport open sensory area as part of Mental Health Awareness Week

Newcastle Airport has become the first airport in the North to open a sensory area for passengers with hidden disabilities.

The area, which has been opened during Mental Health Awareness Week, provides a designated relaxing and safe environment for passengers with hidden disabilities such as autism, dementia, sensory issues and mental health issues.

The calming sensory area has been specially designed to support relaxation and deescalation for passengers who may need to escape when those busy airport surroundings become overwhelming.

Departing passengers who need to use it will be able to relax in the serene space before they fly – and airport staff can guide travellers safely to the location.




The open area is free to use and is aimed exclusively for passengers with hidden or physical disabilities to use.

The area features a specially-designed bubble tube, a calming LED fibre optic 'softie' and a disco ball – all of which are specially designed to stimulate the senses as well as improve motor skills.

It is also completely padded to provide a comfortable and relaxing environment for users.

Representatives from the Toby Henderson Trust, the North East Autism Society and The Children's Foundation joined airport staff today (FRIDAY MAY 17<sup>th</sup>) to watch as the area was officially opened to the public.



Richard Knight, Chief Operating Officer at Newcastle Airport, said: "The passenger journey entails travelling through a busy environment – which can cause stress for people with hidden disabilities.

"I think it is absolutely fantastic that we have been able to provide this new service and I hope that it will make a true difference to the passengers who will use it.

Kerrie Highcock, Family Development Manager of the North East Autism Society, added: "The North East Autism Society has a longstanding relationship with Newcastle International Airport through training and partnering to provide 'passports' for autistic travellers.

"We are thrilled that a further step has been taken to once more make the North East, and Newcastle International Airport, an exceptional place for people whose sensory needs usually preclude them from such spaces.

"We look forward to the great reports coming back as the world opens up for more and more people thanks to incredible initiatives such as this one to make a sensory space available to passengers. Well done NIA!

Acting CEO/Trustee of the Children's Foundation, Dr Sue Vernon, said: "Airports are stress filled places for us all and the sensory room is a brilliant additive to the airport, bringing a space of calmness for children and young people with sensory problems."


Sarah Stephenson, Community Fundraising Partner for the Toby Henderson Trust, added: "I think that this has been a very well thought out project by the airport – and the sensory area is in a great and quiet location.

"It has real potential to calm children down who may be anxious about their journey, and it will be a great support for parents or carers travelling with them."

The sensory area will have limited availability; however passengers do not need to book for usage.




Dippy the Diplodocus lived in London for over 100 years but now he's on an adventure around the UK's best family museums.

Over a 1/4 million people need Changing Places toilets to enable them to get out and about and enjoy the day-to-day activities many of us take for granted.

The Changing Places Consortium launched its campaign in 2006 on behalf of the over 1/4 of a million people who cannot use standard accessible toilets. This includes people with profound and multiple learning disabilities, motor neurone disease, multiple sclerosis, cerebral palsy, as well as older

people.



To use the toilet in safety and comfort, many people need to be able to access a Changing Places, which have more space and the right equipment, including a height adjustable changing bench and a hoist.




