

Pupil Premium – A Quick Guide for Parents and Carers

What is Pupil Premium?

The pupil premium grant is funding provided to schools to improve educational outcomes for pupils. The funding is allocated to schools based on the number of:

- pupils who are registered for free school meals
- pupils who have been registered for free school meals at any point over the last 6 years
- pupils who are, or have been in care
- pupils who have parents in the armed forces.

How can I help ensure Hadrian School gets the maximum funding?

The more eligible pupils that are registered for free school meals, the more funding the school receives. Registering does not mean your child has to take up free school meals if they don't want to.

You should still register for free school meals even if:

- your child already receives universal infant free school meals
- you would rather your child had a different meal, such as a packed lunch
- Your child has a gastrostomy and does not eat orally.

How is Pupil Premium funding used?

Pupil Premium is not a personal budget for individual pupils. At Hadrian School our aim is to use pupil premium funding to help us achieve outcomes for our pupils. We help all our children overcome their personal difficulties through highly trained and expert specialist teaching, through our highly individualised curriculum approach and our partnership work with parents / carers and health professionals.
