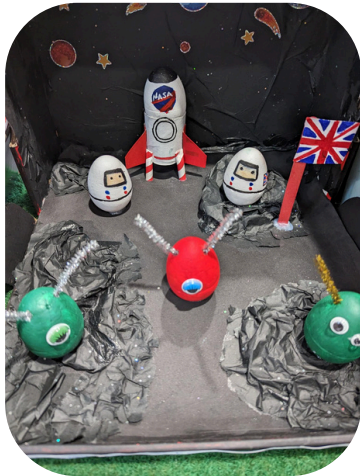
## Easter Egg Competition

## Class Spotlight:

**1-2T**

This half term, 1/2T and 2L have been exploring how the Great Fire of London changed Britain and helped shape many of the safety measures we have today. The children have been fascinated learning about the events of 1666 and thinking carefully about how people fought the fire using only buckets of water from the River Thames.

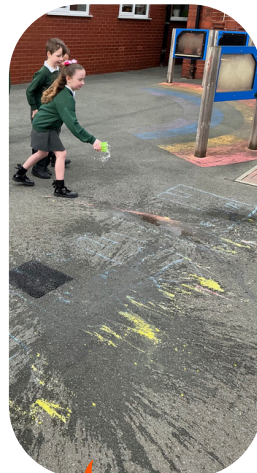
To bring this learning to life, we went out into the playground to recreate what it might have been like to pass buckets along a human chain. The children quickly discovered just how challenging and slow this method would have been!

We are also linking our Design and Technology work to this topic. Over the next few weeks, the children will be designing and making their own fire vehicles, learning how wheels and axles work, and thinking about how these inventions have helped firefighters tackle fires far more effectively than in the past.

Our school target for attendance is **96%**

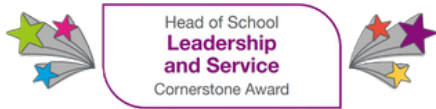
NHS guidance is that your child is fine to attend school even if they have a sniffle or cough. Please only keep your child off school if they are too ill to attend.
