It also means when they do have any worries, they're more likely to come and speak to you. But it can also be easy to become overwhelmed with the different technology, the language that children use, the huge number of games and apps which are available and the potential risks.

The NSPCC website (https://www.nspcc.org.uk/) has some fantastic top tips for helping to keep your child safe online. You could have fun finding out how much your family already knows with a quiz or search for online words and phrases in a word search (do you know what they all mean?).

You could even consider creating an online safety family agreement to help keep your whole family safe online.
