Play Fitness Limited; Reception Mini-Gym	£9,604.21	The reception-aged children now have access to a multi-use, all-weather outdoor gym facility which allows them to develop and refine their gross motor skills, balance, coordination and confidence to partake physically and cooperatively. This will lead more children within the cohort to be able to join more confidently within structured P.E. learning experiences both in Reception and as they move up to Key Stage 1.
Start2Finish Coaching Programme (Quality- assured external P.E. Provider)	£3,528	By employing specialist sports coaches to work on a timetabled basis with assigned classes, together with structured lunchtime sessions and regular after-school clubs, we have continued to develop Hebburn Lakes' P.E. and sport offer to our children by ensuring that they have had opportunities to partake in as many high-quality P.E. experiences as possible this year. The coaches are always shadowed by our teaching staff so that every opportunity to develop their own P.E. practice is secured. Children develop good relationships with our coaches and duly treat them with the same respect as everyone in school - this leads to an extremely positive climate for learning as children are well-motivated to achieve, having seen P.E. and sport-specific skills demonstrated by specialists.

3) Increased confidence, knowledge and skills of all staff in teaching PE and sport.

'COMPLETE P.E.' Curriculum Resource	£1,847.50	Priorly delayed due to COVID-19, the sustainable investment in Complete P.E. (commencing in the 2021/22 academic year) will transform our staff's confidence to deliver high-quality P.E. across school. Focussed assessment within schemes of learning will allow trends in attainment across school to be tracked. Teacher competence will improve, workload will be reduced and CPD opportunities that the scheme offers will be exploited where required. Resultantly, our children's experience of P.E. across school will significantly improve along with their projected attainment and enjoyment. The P.E. Subject-Lead (Craig Campbell) has delivered a related session of introductory twilight training to disseminate the necessary information to all teaching staff. This will be bolstered with further training after distributing a staff questionnaire in the autumn term.

'RELAX KIDS' (Yoga & Mindfulness sessions held across school bought in from an external partner).	£1600	Children across school have enjoyed their timetabled block of 'Relax Kids' sessions, in which they have experienced a range of meditation, yoga and mindfulness sessions. This has allowed children to be more conscious of the importance of positive thinking, calming techniques and the impact of spending too much time engaged with electronic devices, for example. This has been particularly valuable in a year in which many of our children have been negatively affected by the Lockdown periods. Children have appeared more settled across school during the weeks in which 'Relax Kids' has taken place and the feedback from both children and teachers alike has been extremely positive.
Full P.E.Stock Audit followed by a comprehensive suite of planned curriculum purchases to enable teachers to deliver the 'Complete P.E. scheme.	£7366.85	Teachers at Hebburn Lakes Primary School are now well-equipped to teach the 'Complete P.E.' schemes of learning with their classes. The resources are fully aligned to the teaching and learning requirements of each year-group syllabus and we envisage that the bulk of the equipment is of sufficient quality to last for at least the next 3 academic years in order to offer value-for-money and longevity to our school over time.
Bulk purchase of playtime and lunchtime equipment staples.	£1334.20	Hebburn Lakes Primary School has invested in our playground equipment stock to enable children across school to have access to new play equipment and enable their outdoor time to be as active as possible. These new purchases include equipment such as hulahoops, tag-belts, rubber quoits, a range of balls, floor markers and mini-stilts etc. A significant social and emotional component of this aspect of our offer to our children is the instilling of the importance of taking care of the equipment, playing cooperatively and learning to compromise.
Hope Education Play Trikes for Reception.	£597.98	A set of play trikes have complemented our Reception children's outside play space and allowed more children to be active during the day as well as developing their ability to share and take turns.

5) Increased participation in competitive sport.

*Due to the national and local impact on extra-curricular sport due to COVID-19 and in line with our school risk assessment, Hebburn Lakes Primary School was unable to partake in any inter-school competition this year. Plans have already been made to resume this in earnest during the Autumn Term 2021, with entry into the Primary Schools Football League for our Upper Key Stage Two children alongside a range of other inter and intra-school events.

NEXT STEPS AND ACTIONS TO ACHIEVE FOR HEBBURN LAKES PRIMARY SCHOOL

• Staff will fully implement the *Complete P.E.* scheme of work and make their first assessments of their children using the assessment portal;

- Any areas of CPD need will be evaluated and actioned to ensure all teaching staff feel confident to deliver highquality P.E. sessions in 2021/22;
- We will look to build upon our pre-COVID-19 progress within the School Games Mark Awards and aim to achieve the SILVER Accreditation for 2021/22;
- We will continue to monitor our swimming cohorts' performance and in liaison with our School Swimming Partners, timetable additional instruction where needed for the 2021/22 Year 6 cohort, once their proficiency is clear. The Year 6 cohort will attend swimming lessons in the Autumn term and any additional catch-up will be scheduled throughout the remainder of the year.
