RE Day February 2025

In Reception the children talked about a variety of Holy Books. How they have to be treated with respect and the importance of them in people's lives. We looked at the books and discussed how the writing in them is different to the writing we see in the bible. Some of the children talked about their experiences of reading the Bible and going to church. We then read a story from the Bible called 'The Lost Sheep'.





In year I the children learned about why Jesus is special to Christians and why people are important to us. They wrote about what they think Jesus might look like and made friendship flowers.



In year 2 they learned about why the Bible is special to Christians. How to be a good person, books of the bible and the story of Mary Jones.





In year 3 the children learned about the characteristics of Christian worship. They then created their own designs of stain glass windows.



In year 4 the children learned about why lent is such an important period for Christians. They then talked about symbols of Easter and created beautiful artwork.







In year 5 the children learned what Christians believe about God. They then discussed, wrote and drew what it is believed that God created.





In year 6 they were looking at why people care about the environment. They made a mind map of all of the threats to our planet and its environment, working in groups and sharing ideas. Then they researched one of these threats and presented this information back to the class. Threats such as deforestation, climate change, land and ocean pollution. Then they thought about anything that they could do to show that we care about our local environment. Deciding on a litter pick they went outside of school and had a big tidy up. Now they know that all of this litter will not pollute our local rivers or end up as ocean pollution.
