RE Day October 2025

In Reception the children learned about the Harvest Festival. They found out why it is celebrated and that it is also Christian celebration in church. Some of the children explained why they had been to a church in the past, for a christening and a wedding. They then investigated some vegetables, talking about their smells and textures. After that we read the story of Oliver's vegetables and the children discussed their favourite vegetables.





In year I they learned about the symbols/features of a Church and also what Christians believe about God. They talked about and sorted 'actions that would make the world a better place'.



In year 2 they learned why Moses is special to Jewish people and created a moving picture.



In year 3 the children learned about the main beliefs of Hindu's, Hindu gods and goddesses and how Hindu's worship. They also made a small Diwali lamp as Hindu's have celebrated this special day recently.





In year 4 the children spent the day looking over the story of the Good Samaritan, discussed the parts of the old and new testament, created a comic strip retelling of the good samaritan and practiced the theme of being a good neighbour by tidying the yard, picking up litter and gathering loose opal equipment.
