



RE Day February 2026








In year 1 the children learned about why Jesus is special to Christians and why people are important to us. They wrote about what they think Jesus might look like and made friendship flowers.





In year 2 they learned about why the Bible is special to Christians. How to be a good person, books of the bible and the story of Mary Jones.




In year 3 the children learned about the characteristics of Christian worship. They then created their own designs of stain glass windows.




In year 4 the children learned about why Lent is such an important period for Christians. They then created Lent promise wheels, creating some beautiful work.






In year 5 the children learned what Christians believe about God. They then discussed, wrote and drew what it is believed that God created.
