## <u>Highfield Middle School – Provider Access Statement Introduction</u>

This policy statement sets out Highfield Middle School's arrangements for managing the access of post-16 providers to all year groups, to enable students to make fully informed rational education and career pathway decisions.

We believe in building strong relationships with local schools with a sixth form, further education and sixth form colleges, apprenticeship providers, universities and employers. Our careers programme includes a large number of opportunities for external providers to talk to and interact with students and their parents, ensuring they are aware of vocational and technical pathways and opportunities as well as academic ones.

Members of staff are regularly sent information to ensure that they are up-to-date in their knowledge of the full range of post-16 opportunities available to students.

## **Learner Entitlement**

Learners in years 7-13 are entitled:

- To find out about technical education qualifications and apprenticeship opportunities, as part of a careers programme which provides information on the full range of education and training options available at each transition point.
- To hear from a range of local providers about the opportunities they offer, including technical education and apprenticeships through (but not exclusively) options events, assemblies and group discussions and taster events.
- To understand how to make applications for the full range of academic and technical courses.
