


Kepier Honours Programme Become a <u>Lead Learner</u> in Kepier!

Expectations of the Post

Whole School	Be a positive role model for all learners by ensuring that you: - Arrive in school and in lessons on time. - Wear full school uniform at all times. - Complete all classwork and homework on time. - Maintain high personal standards of behaviour in and outside of school. - Be respectful and helpful with all staff in school. Provide support with:
	 School events e.g. open evenings, parents evenings, charity events, prom Support SLT roles where appropriate e.g. show visitors and new learners around the school. Support in running an after school clubs/ homework club. Take a lead in whole school initiatives such as raising money for charity, promoting anti-bullying, promoting respect amongst all learners. Liaise with the student council and core members of SLT.
Supervision	 Undertake supervision duties as organised by the lead teacher: Carry out at least one break time duty each week. Reliably attend break time duty (or arrange suitable replacement from other Honours learners) Arrive promptly to your duty point. Contribute in the tidy up of the area at the end of break.
Coaching	Work with the relevant teachers to support with coaching resources: - Contribute in delivering assemblies. - Organise/support with coaching activities. - Create resources, coordinate displays, organise quizzes etc.
Learner Voice	 Take part in learner voice groups and surveys to provide feedback. Help with the organising of other learner voice tasks. Be willing to listen to other learners' problems and relay anything back to the Honours programme lead teacher.
Behaviour	 Look out for younger learners and provide support where needed. Report any incidents to members of staff so that poor behaviour can be dealt with.
Privileges	 You can include the role on your CV/ college and job applications. Identifying badge to be worn on your school tie. Position of responsibility within the school.
