

Ebacc Pathway



The EBacc is a set of subjects at GCSE that keeps young people's options open for further study and future careers.

The EBacc is:

- English language and literature
- maths
- the sciences
- geography or history
- a language

Your child will follow the Ebacc pathway in Y9. Only a few learners will follow a different pathway.

The School will determine which learners they are.

The government's ambition is to see 75% of pupils studying the EBacc subject combination at GCSE by 2022, and 90% by 2025.
