In 2017-18 the funding was £180,837.00

Cohort mobility continues to be very high making year on year comparisons very difficult. In 2017, 54% of the disadvantaged achieved GLD in comparison with 63% of non-disadvantaged (-9). There were 16 disadvantaged children in the 2018 cohort; 56% achieved GLD in comparison with 69% of non-disadvantaged (-12). At the end of 2018 KS1 attainment outcomes for the disadvantaged children reaching the expected standard in Reading, Writing and Maths was above the national average. This was also the case for the greater depth

The number of children passing the Year 1 phonics screen dipped this year compared to last year. The significance of the level of transience in this cohort towards the end of the academic year are the main cause of this. Disadvantage pupils still made accelerated progress in their phonics. Key Stage 2 attainment at the expected standard in Reading and Maths for the disadvantaged pupils was at or above national average. Progress measure for Key Stage 2 indicate the disadvantaged children performed better than the non-disadvantaged pupils in Reading and Maths. There was a slight difference in writing where they did not make as much progress overall as the non- disadvantaged. A strength of the school and the curriculum, noted by Ofsted in Feb 2018 is the extensive
gap of disadvantaged pupils.
