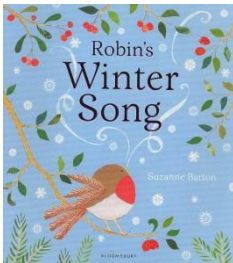

Y

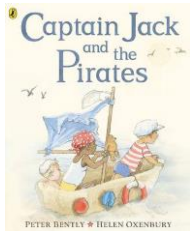
The Queen has her handbag stolen by a naughty seagull. How many familiar British landmarks can you find in the search for the missing bag?

Y

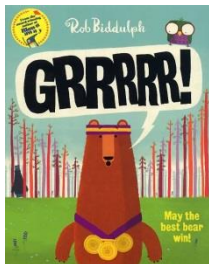
Robin is getting worried as all the other animals are getting ready for winter. Should he be worried too? A story that also introduces winter and all the delights of that season.

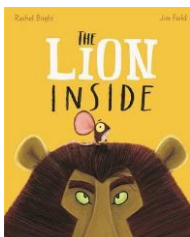
Illustrated by Helen Oxenbury, this is the story of three small boys who have a wonderfully imaginative adventure in their sand boat.

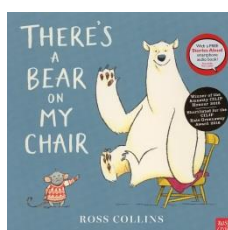
The latest addition to this fun series of counting books in which ten little monsters are caught in a creepy castle.

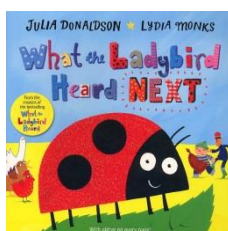
The story of how Lily and Blue Kangaroo first met as well as looking at changing family dynamics when Lily's baby brother is born.

Y

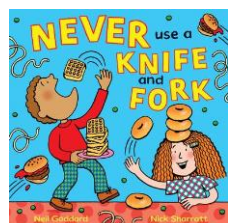

Y

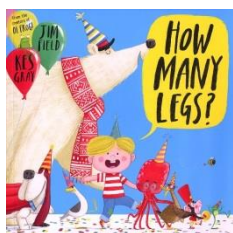

Y

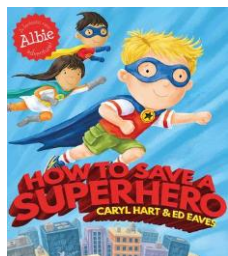
A completely irreverent look at table manners and how not to eat your food. Perfect for reading aloud.

Y

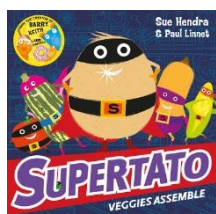
A fun counting book in which a boy tries to work out how many legs would be involved if all his favourite animals came to tea.

Y

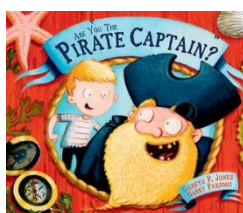
Albie's latest imaginative adventure in which he encounters superheroes whilst supposedly tidying his room. Can he make it back home in time for an ice cream?

Y

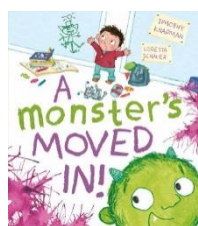
Supertato is called on again to save the supermarket when Evil Pea turns the freezers off. Can Supertato and his new superfriends save the day yet again.

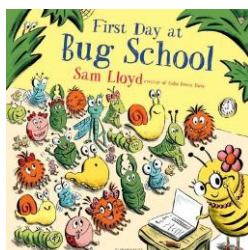
A rollicking rhyming story about a pirate crew who have lost their captain. Can they find a replacement or is the best candidate already under their noses?

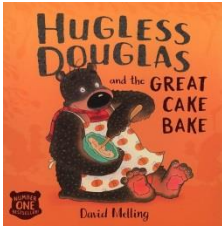
What do you do on wet afternoon when you can't go outside? Build a den of course, but what do you do when a monster decides to join you?

Y

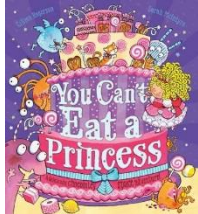
A look at the various goings on at the Bug School at the bottom of your garden. An ideal introduction to going to school.

Y

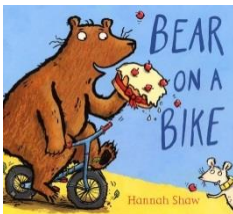

Y

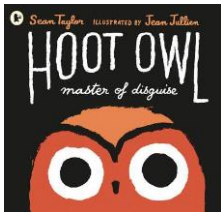
