Gregory Cool & Hot Like Fire! - the Caribbean

English

A range of texts used to teach reading, writing & spoken English though shared or guided reading & class readers, including:

Narrative

'Gregory Cool' by Caroline Binch - stories from other cultures e.g. predictions, booktalk prompts, think, say, feel bubbles, dialogue, writing letters in role, story writing

Non-narrative

'Coming to England' by Floella Benjamin & texts/films about the Windrush Generation (recount/diaries/information texts)

Poetry

'Hot Like Fire' - Caribbean poets and poetry
'Who Dat Girl', 'De' & 'Chicken Dinner' by Valerie Bloom; 'Emily
Hurricane' by Alan Smith & 'Windrush Child' by John Agard

Hurricane' by Alan Smith & 'Windrush Child' by John Agard Discuss, respond to comprehension, read aloud & perform, compare dialect & accent e.g. compare to the Lambton Worm

GPaS activities e.g. hold a sentence/dictation, spellings, word of the day

 Painting techniques used by the French Impressionists (Claude Monet, Seurat) e.g. Pointillism

Build a bug hotel - link to Science (outdoor learning)

Mathematics

- Basic Skills daily practice of times tables, number facts appropriate to year groups
- Additive & Multiplicative Reasoning daily calculation strategies using Calculation posters differentiated to stage/age
- Geometric Reasoning revisit properties of 2D/3D shapes, symmetry, angles, perimeter & translation
- Problem solving & Reasoning using mathematical talk and varied fluency to solve different types of problems e.g. pattern spotting, finding all the possibilities

- What do Hindus believe and how does this affect the way they live their lives? Y3/4
