In the Summer Term children will:

- be confident to try new activities and show independence and resilience when facing a challenge.
- think about how far they have come in Reception.
- Take part in sport's day and learn about winning and losing.
- Talk about rules and why it is important to have and follow rules.

Understanding the World

- Children will be encouraged to make simple comparisons.
- Children will explore different materials and their properties.
- Children will share non-fiction texts that give an insight into contrasting environments.
- Children will investigate magnets linked to finding treasure.
- Children will learn facts about sea animals and creatures.
- The children will continue to learn about special buildings and worship there.

Communication and Language Literacy

- Reading Set 2 sounds (from RWInc. Scheme)
- Reading Ditties and Red Ditty books and green story books. (RWInc Scheme)
- To be able to blend and segment simple words.
- To be able segment sounds in simple words and blend them together.
- To be able to read simple sentences.
- Expressing themselves through drawing, painting and writing.
- To continue writing labels and captions.
- To write short sentences in meaningful context.

Physical Development

- Children will do a weekly P.E lesson following 'Real PE'.
- Children show good control and co-ordination in large and small movements.
- They handle equipment and tools effectively, including pencils for writing.
- Children know the importance for good health of physical exercise, and a healthy diet, and talk about ways to keep healthy and safe.
- Continue to develop pencil grip and letter formation.

Mathematics

- Children will continue to look at numbers beyond 10 and explore counting patterns beyond 10.
- Deepening understanding in number - patterns and relationships.
- They will further develop spatial reasoning skills and look at mapping.

Expressive Arts and Design

- Children will explore colour mixing.
- They represent their own ideas, thoughts and feelings through design and technology, art, music, dance, role play and stories.
- Children will engage in crafts linked to the pirate theme.
- Puppet shows - encouraging story telling skills and imagination.
