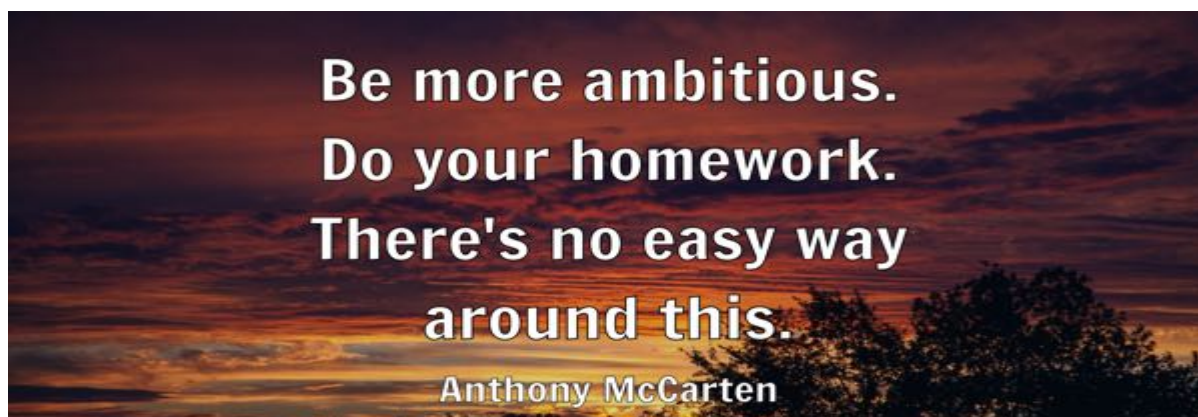

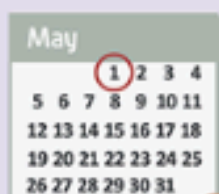

## Issues with logging in?

Sparx uses the same login across Core Subjects. Use your Maths login details.

- Use the function to login via Google
  - Log into your school account, either via the school website or on the Google homepage
  - Ensure that any other Google profiles have been properly signed out of otherwise it will try to get into Sparx with a personal email and won't work.
- If you have forgotten your password, put in your username details (this is normally your email address) and then request a password reset.
  - This is sent to your maths teacher who has to approve the request.
  - This will be done during the working week and will take a day or two. If requesting a password reset over the weekend you will need to wait until Monday.
