## English - Talk 4 Writing

As part of our Talk for Writing units, we will be exploring a range of engaging key texts. Through these, children will be developing their use of ambitious vocabulary, fronted adverbials and powerful verbs to bring their descriptions to life.

Yellow Class: The lost happy endings

Orange Class: The wilderness

Red Class: Pax

## Science

In Science, KS2 pupils learn about plants, identifying the parts of flowering plants and what they need to grow and stay healthy. They explore plant life cycles and how seeds are formed and dispersed, developing observation and enquiry skills..

## History

In History, pupils learn about changes in Britain from the Stone Age to the Iron Age. They explore how people lived, including homes, tools, and food, and how life changed over time, developing an understanding of chronology and cause and consequence..

## Maths

In Year 3 Maths, pupils will develop secure written methods through column addition and column subtraction, building accuracy and confidence when working with larger numbers. Children will strengthen their understanding of the 2, 4, and 8 times tables and use these facts to solve a range of mathematical problems. Pupils will also explore unit fractions as part of a whole, helping them understand how quantities can be divided equally and represented using fractions.

Y4 will explore coordinates, using grids to describe and plot positions accurately. Children will review their knowledge of fractions, revisiting unit and non-unit fractions, before moving on to the composition of fractions greater than one. Pupils will learn to compare and order mixed numbers and place them correctly on a number line, helping them build confidence, accuracy, and a deeper understanding of fractions and number relationships.

## Computing

In Computing, pupils design and create their own simple digital games. They learn how games are planned, made, and improved, developing creativity, problem-solving skills, and an understanding of how digital media is created.

## Religious Education

In RE, pupils explore what it means to be a Hindu living in Britain today. They learn about key beliefs, festivals, and practices, and consider how faith influences daily life, helping them develop respect and understanding of different religions.

## Art / D&T

In Art, pupils explore textiles and collage by combining fabrics, papers, and materials to create layered artwork. They develop skills in cutting, joining, and arranging materials, experimenting with texture, colour, and pattern to express ideas creatively.

## Physical Education

In PE, pupils take part in invasion games, developing skills such as passing, attacking, and defending. They learn to work as a team, use simple tactics, and improve coordination, communication, and fair play.

## French

In French, pupils learn to talk about animals and ask and answer simple questions, such as *As-tu un animal ?*. They develop their speaking and listening skills, build vocabulary, and gain confidence using basic French sentences.
