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MESSAGE FROM THE HEADTEACHER

Dear Parent/Carer and students

Welcome to our first newsletter of the 2020/21 academic year. It has been a sobering half term and one which has been full of mixed emotions.

The untimely passing of our Deputy Head girl Holly Baddiley has been devastating to all who knew her and her family. Her diagnosis of Hodgkin Lymphoma in September was a shock but we could never have anticipated that she would have passed away so suddenly due to the fact she was responding well to treatment.

We have set up a book of condolence and a table of memories in the library for anyone to come and spend some time thinking of Holly and the wonderful person she was. You can also bring flowers to the school and lay them at the front of the Maple Park Centre, just outside reception.



Holly's funeral will be held on

the Friday of the half term break, at a socially distanced ceremony with limited numbers (invitation only) due to the pandemic. Red roses will be laid on her grave to remember her love of Alice in Wonderland and Beauty and the Beast.

Murray Park students will get a chance to say goodbye and remember Holly on a non-uniform day we plan to hold to coincide with Remembrance Day 11th November. We will send more information out closer to the time, as well as other ways we will remember Holly.

We have had two COVID-19 cases in school this half term, which were both contracted within the homes of those infected and we took immediate action to ask anyone who was in contact to self-isolate for 14 days. This shows that our distancing and self-isolation measures are working to ensure everyone is safe. Please see the leaflet on Page 7 which Derby City have published about the steps to take should your child experience any symptoms. Thank you for your cooperation and support in this matter.

Today we enjoyed our headteacher reward assembly which was brought



together only small numbers in separate year group bubbles - very different to the usual busy rewards events. Well done to all those who received an award—you are a credit to Murray Park School.

Thank you for all your support in the last few weeks. Have a good rest with your families and I look forward to returning in November ready to learn and celebrate Holly's life in a spectacular way!

ASPIRATIONS, CAREERS AND EMPLOYABILITY NEWS









We have delivered a number of careers lessons for our Y10 and Y11 students to help them plan for their futures Post 16.

To support students with career planning and to support them to make well informed choices about their next steps we've encouraged them to register on https://pathwayctm.com/for-school-leavers/ platform where they can find out about all the options post GCSE and A-Level, create CVs and covering letters; master the art of networking on LinkedIn; understand their strengths and how they can help them in their career journey; learn how to win at assessment centres, and smash the 1-2-1 interview by phone, online and face to face.

Students can take part in regular employer and industry events, giving students a platform to speak to employers directly, and find out what it's really like embarking on a career with them. Check out current opportunities, including Apprenticeships, Work Experience and Internship placements, Sponsored Degrees, Training Programmes and Gap Year programmes, and use our Student support to help you through the whole process.

There is a parent's newsletter which you can register for https://pathwayctm.com/parents/ which we would strongly encourage you to do which. It will give you the tools and information to support your child choosing Post 16 pathways and help them career plan for the future and make well informed choices.

Examinations news for Year 10 and Year 11

There are also several real external exams taking place during the January — March 2021 period including one for Engineering in the first week of the mocks. 

Once on the web app do the following:

- · Enter your LOCATION
- Choose your PREFERRED LOCKER AREA from the drop down menu (if available)
- Click on CHECK AVAILABILITY
- Where prompted enter your details and read and agree to the terms and conditions
- Click on RENT LOCKER and follow the instructions for entering your payment details
- You will then be emailed a locker code and the number of your locker compartment.

How to Access your Locker:

- Go to the locker number detailed on your confirmation email
- Enter the 4 digit code detailed on your confirmation email and open the lock
- Should you forget your code it can reissued by visiting www.locker.rentals and clicking on the re-issue my locker code link.

B-LINE CARD CHANGES

Derbyshire County Council have changed the way they administer the b line scheme. Previously we have been using a photography service in school, but it has now moved over to a fully online system in order to streamline and speed up the application process, as well as reduce costs. From the end of November 2019 all Derbyshire 11 to 18 year olds will instead be able to apply online for their b_line card.

The link to the new online application portal is https://bline.derbyshire.gov.uk/home.faces



Applicants will be required to enter their email address and set up a password to register. They will then receive an email to activate their account and then proceed to enter their name, address, date of birth and upload a head and shoulders photograph. T&C's must be read and acknowledged by the parent/guardian of students for b_line1 cards and by the student themselves for b_line2 cards. The card will be sent direct to the student's home address within 5 working days of application.

COVID-19 (coronavirus) absence: let's do the right thing for Derby City Council





What to do if	Action needed	Back to school
my child has COVID- 19 (coronavirus) symptoms*	Child shouldn't attend school Child should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results	when child's test comes back negative provided they have been fever free for the 48 hours before returning to school, and feel well
my child tests positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	Child shouldn't attend school Child self-isolates for at least 10 days from when symptoms' started (or from day of test if no symptoms) Inform school immediately about test results Whole household self-isolates for 14 days from day when symptoms' started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - even if someone tests negative during those 14 days	after 10 days, once child feels better, and has been fever-free for at least 48 hours They can return to school after 10 days even if they have a cough or loss of smell / taste. These symptoms can last for several weeks once the infection is gone.
somebody in my household has COVID- 19 (coronavirus) symptoms*	Child shouldn't attend school Household member with symptoms should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results	when household member test is negative, and child does not have COVID-19 symptoms*
somebody in my household has tested positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	Child shouldn't attend school Whole household self-isolates for 14 days from day when symptoms* started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - even if someone tests negative during those 14 days	when child has completed 14 days of self-isolation, even if they test negative during the 14 days

Symptoms include at least one of a high temperature; a new continuous cough; a loss of or change to your sense of smell or taste.

NHS Test and Trace has identified my child as a 'close contact' of a confirmed COVID-19 (coronavirus) case	Child shouldn't attend school Child self-isolates for 14 days (as advised by NHS Test and Trace) – even if they test negative during those 14 days Rest of household does not need to self-isolate, unless they are a 'close contact' too	when the child has completed 14 days of self-isolation, even if they test negative during those 14 days
we / my child has travelled and has to self- isolate as part of a period of quarantine	Do not take unauthorised leave in term time Consider quarantine requirements and FCO advice when booking travel Provide information to school as per attendance policy Returning from a destination where quarantine is needed: Child shouldn't attend school Whole household self-isolates for 14 days – even if they test negative during those 14 days	when the quarantine period of 14 days has been completed for the child, even if they test negative during those 14 days
we have received advice from a medical / official source that my child must resume shielding	Child shouldn't attend school Contact school as advised by attendance officer / pastoral team Child should shield until you are informed that restrictions are lifted and shielding is paused again	when school / other agencies inform you that restrictions have been lifted and your child can return to school again
I am not sure who should get a test for COVID -19 (coronavirus)	Only people with symptoms* need to get a test People without symptoms are not advised to get a test, even if they are a 'close contact' of someone who tests positive	when conditions above, as matching your situation, are met
