



FREE SCHOOL MEALS ELIGIBILITY

How to check if your child is eligible for free school meals

It only takes a few minutes to can check your eligibility online, although you will need the following information to hand before starting your online application:

Your own name and date of birth

Your National Insurance number or National Asylum Seekers number

Your email address

Your child/ren's date of birth

PARENTPAY - ONLINE PAYMENT SERVICE

ParentPay is our preferred method of making payments to school. This is a secure online payments system accessed via a website where parents & carers can use their credit or debit card to pay for school trips and school meals.

COVID-19 TESTING AT HOME

Students will now be moving to twice weekly, rapid COVID-19 testing at home. This is following their first three supervised tests on site at school.

Up to 1 in 3 people who have COVID-19 have no symptoms and could be spreading it without knowing. Getting into a regular habit of testing twice a week will help stop the virus spreading, keeping your family and friends safer.

We have sent home 2 COVID-19 testing kits with your child last week after their third test. Please make sure your child tests themselves twice a week 3-5 days apart, in the morning before school if possible and, if not, the evening before.

Your child should also **continue testing twice a week, at home, throughout the Easter school holidays**. We will be sending home 2 extra test kits for Easter holiday before term ends.

This does not replace testing for those with symptoms. If you have symptoms you must self-isolate immediately, book a PCR test and follow national guidelines.

Reporting results

It is really important that results of test are reported online straight away, even if your child's result is negative or void. It's easy to do at www.gov.uk/report-covid19-result.

Results can also be reported via telephone by calling 119 (free from mobiles and landlines). Lines are open every day, 7am to 11pm.

It is important to keep a note of your child's results and share with school by using this link http://tiny.cc/8twqtz or scan the QR code using your phones camera app.

Testing for parents, households and bubbles twice a week

A reminder that regular rapid testing is now also available for parents, their households and support or childcare bubbles. The government is encouraging all families to participate in twice weekly testing to help stop the spread. Parents and other adults in the household can access tests by:

Ordering tests online www.gov.uk/order-school-household-tests

Getting an assisted test at work, if it is available

Attending a test site to get tested (where you will be able to see how to take the test) or pick up tests to do at home.

COVID-19 (coronavirus) absence: A quick guide for parents / carers



my child has COVID- 19 (coronavirus) symptoms*	Child shouldn't attend school Child should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results	when child's test comes back negative provided they have been fever free for the 48 hours before returning to school, and feel well
my child tests positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	Child shouldn't attend school Child self-isolates for at least 10 days from when symptoms' started (or from day of test if no symptoms) Inform school immediately about test results Whole household self-isolates for 10 days from day when symptoms' started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - even if someone tests negative during those 10 days	after 10 days, once child feels better, and has been fever-free for at least 48 hours They can return to school after 10 days even if they have a cough or loss of smell / taste. These symptoms can last for several weeks once the infection is gone.
somebody in my household has COVID- 19 (coronavirus) symptoms*	Child shouldn't attend school Household member with symptoms should get a test Whole household self-isolates while waiting for test result Inform school immediately about test results	when household member test is negative, and child does not have COVID-19 symptoms*
somebody in my household has tested positive for COVID-19 (coronavirus)	Child shouldn't attend school Whole household self-isolates for 10 days from day when symptoms' started (or from day of test if no symptoms) - even if someone tests negative during those 10 days	when child has completed 10 days of self-isolation, even if they test negative during the 10 days

Symptoms include at least one of a high temperature; a new continuous cough; a loss of or change to your sense of smell or taste.

NHS Test and Trace has identified my child as a 'close contact' of a confirmed COVID-19 (coronavirus) case	Child shouldn't attend school Child self-isolates for 10 days (as advised by NHS Test and Trace) – even if they test negative during those 10 days Rest of household does not need to self-isolate, unless they are a 'close contact' too	when the child has completed 10 days of self-isolation, even if they test negative during those 10 days
we / my child has travelled and has to self- isolate as part of a period of quarantine	Do not take unauthorised leave in term time Consider quarantine requirements and FCO advice when booking travel Provide information to school as per attendance policy Returning from a destination where quarantine is needed: Child shouldn't attend school Whole household self-isolates for 10 days – even if they test negative during those 10 days	when the quarantine period of 10 days has been completed for the child, even if they test negative during those 10 days
