
Ambition Statement

At Murray Park School, our curriculum vision is to provide an ambitious and inspirational education for all our pupils. Our strong set of values: Perseverance; Respect; Independence; Dreams and Excellence (PRIDE) underpin our ethos, developing cultural capital in all we do. Through our curriculum, our pupils develop the confidence to embrace the responsibilities that life has to offer and to become valued members of the community, both now and in the future.

In all lessons the pupils are challenged and engaged in an education which prepares them for their futures. Our curriculum enables all of our pupils to develop life skills, such as, creativity, empathy and collaboration, resulting in resilient individuals with high aspirations. Our health and well-being provision ensures that our pupils lead healthy and fulfilling lives and that every pupil has the knowledge and confidence to take care of their own health and well-being.

As a result of our outstanding careers programme, all of our pupils are prepared for the next stage of their education, training and employment through our extensive network of business partners and dedicated careers centre. Our wide range of extra-curricular activities include residential opportunities and international travel. These opportunities enrich the formal curriculum and deepen the pupils' knowledge and skills.

Every child at Murray Park School is equipped to become a well-qualified and successful young person.



Curriculum Rationale

All pupils in Years 7 to 11 follow the National Curriculum which is divided into core and foundation subjects:

Core Subjects - English, Mathematics and Science.

Foundation Subjects - Geography, History, Religious Studies, Modern Foreign Languages, Computing, Art and Design, Music, Drama, Textiles, Engineering, Design and Technology, Physical Education and Personal, Social, Health and Economic Education, Citizenship and Relationships and Sex Education. At Key Stage 4, the students can choose to study a wide variety of subjects as



part of the options process, such as, Business Studies, Construction, Health and Social Care, Ancient History, Photography as well as Citizenship and Politics.

Pupils have the opportunity to follow the English Baccalaureate (EBacc) which is a set of subjects at GCSE that keeps young people's options open for further study and future careers. The EBacc is: English Language and Literature; Maths; the Sciences; Geography or History and a language.

Inclusion

Inspirational teaching and enthusiastic learning are at the heart of our values. All students at Murray Park, whatever their protected characteristic, have equal rights of access to a curriculum that builds on their previous learning.

Murray Park School is a highly inclusive school. We go to great lengths to ensure every child can and does succeed in education. As part of our provision we have developed The Bridge and the Hub which are small, specialised units supporting pupils with additional needs.

We support pupils who access our alternative provision, promoting a learning environment which insists on high expectations and delivers bespoke provision to meet the needs of individuals. Our fantastic community garden has enabled the pupils to work with the local community. In addition, the pupils visit places of work in order to gain an insight into the skills needed for the next stage of their education and training.

Pupil Leadership and Pupil Voice



Education is not simply about lessons in a classroom, it is about seizing every occasion to inspire in our pupils the thirst for knowledge and for them to be able to take every opportunity they may encounter across their school life.

Pupils are therefore given opportunities to demonstrate leadership in lessons, on the sports field or as prefects. They are encouraged to help shape the school through contributions to the Mentoring Scheme, School Parliament and to take an active role in the local and global community by participating in community activities and charitable events. Our senior prefects successfully lead these groups.

We have recently launched a peer mentorship programme which offers outstanding leadership opportunities at the same time as supporting pupil mental health.

A Safe and Caring Environment

Rewards and Responsibilities

Good behaviour is vital to our pupils' progress and achievement in school, as well as developing personal responsibility in the community. The school has a stepped approach to sanctions which encourages positive behaviour – this works alongside the rewards system. Rewards continue to grow and develop, positive rewards are logged for students on Go4Schools, these continue to be highlighted in tutor slides, assemblies and Headteacher award assemblies that take place every half term. All behaviour and reward points can be viewed by parents on their Go4Schools personalised area.

Our rewards system raises the pupils' aspirations and promotes a positive attitude towards school life and beyond. Consequently, pupils at Murray Park School are praised in a variety of ways, such as, through Learner of the Week awards, letters and postcards home, rewards trips and through articles in the school newsletter. The pupils' achievements are also promoted in assemblies and through positive feedback on the students' work. Pupils who have demonstrated excellent attendance and behaviour will have the opportunity to participate in specific trips and activities. The School's Celebration Evening is an annual opportunity to praise the pupils' achievements which is attended by pupils, parents/carers, members of staff and members of the governing body. Pupils at Murray Park School are rewarded for their contribution to all aspects of school life: pastoral, academic, their commitment to the extra-curricular programme and for developing personal responsibility in the community.



The form tutor is the first point of contact and plays a central role in your child's school life:





Enrichment Opportunities

At Murray Park, we place great emphasis on enriching and enhancing the learning of our pupils by encouraging them to try new challenges and experiences that will develop them as individuals beyond their academic studies. For many pupils, the Duke of Edinburgh Award scheme has become a natural and increasingly popular choice at three award levels (Bronze, Silver and Gold). For those talented, sporting students we offer highly successful accredited sports leadership programmes.

We believe that school should provide good memories which last a lifetime and that learning takes place in many different ways and in many different environments. We therefore offer a wide range of extracurricular activities, including trips and visits and a wide range of clubs, activities and opportunities so that pupils can develop interests and talents beyond the formal curriculum.

Our pupils have the opportunity to visit countries, such as, Italy and China.

Transition from Year 6 to 7

'We believe that the support Murray Park offers each child and their parents through this crucial stage in their lives, makes for a successful and smooth transition from primary to secondary school.'

At Murray Park, we have excellent partnerships with all our primary schools and our established and successful transition programme enables pupils to move seamlessly into secondary education.

Before your child joins Murray Park School, extensive liaison will have taken place. We make sure that we know about friendship groups and academic abilities so that we can ensure a smooth transition. Some of our transition work includes:

- Every child receiving a visit from a key member of our transition team.
- · Collecting essential information for us to know your child.
- A tailored induction programme.
- · Additional induction time for pupils who may need extra support.
- Regular communication and updates for families.
- · A Summer School.

Pupils in Years 7 have base rooms which they can use at break and lunchtime in order to spend time with their friends and form new friendships.

Admissions

Applications for admission will be considered from pupils, who are aged 11 without reference to aptitude or ability. The admission number for September 2023 is 280.

Priority for admission will be given to children whose parents have requested a place using the Common Application Form. If the number of applications exceeds the number of places then the following criteria will apply.

- 1. A 'looked after child' or a child who was previously looked after but immediately after being looked after became subject to an adoption, residence, or special quardianship order 67.
- 2. Those living in the defined "normal catchment" area.
- 3. Siblings of those pupils who will be attending the school at the date of admission, in order of proximity.
- 4. Proximity to the school.

In the event of oversubscription, the above criteria will be applied. In cases of a tiebreaker for applications of equal strength, preference will be given to the applicant with the shorter proximity to the school measured by the shortest available route from the home to the main school entrance.

Parents of children not offered a place will be informed of their right of appeal to an independent appeal panel.

School Uniform

All pupils are expected to wear uniform and we appreciate parents and pupils working with us to keep our school smart. Approved school uniform; jumpers and ties can be purchased from our school supplier. All uniform should be marked with the pupils' names.

Basic Uniform:

Navy blazer with the school logo or you can purchase a plain navy blazer and purchase a sew on badge. A plain navy blue v-neck school jumper or cardigan, if desired.

White formal shirt with collar (long or short sleeved)

Black formal full knee length skirt (not tight fitting) or black formal trousers / knee length black tailored shorts

Black formal shoes

Black or navy blue winter coat.

Policies

Meeting the requirements of children with Special Educational Needs: Admission of pupils with disabilities

All pupils are accepted, in accordance with the standard admission procedures. A pupil's disability will not be cause for discrimination when applying for a place at Murray Park and the Governing Body has due regard for the practice advocated in the Code of Practice.

Disability Equality Scheme and Access Arrangements

Murray Park is committed to ensuring equality of education and opportunity for all its pupils whatever their protected characteristic. The aim is to develop a culture of inclusion which allows everyone to participate fully in school life. Achievement of all pupils is monitored carefully and data is used to raise standards and ensure inclusive teaching.

All pupils have access to the full curriculum and it is sufficiently flexible to respond to individual needs. The site aims to cater for those with disabilities and modifications to the existing building have made most areas accessible.

Child Protection Policy

Child protection is defined as safeguarding and promoting the welfare of children by:

- Protecting children from maltreatment.
- Preventing impairment of children's health or development.
- Ensuring children grow up in circumstances consistent with the provision of safe and effective care.
- Taking action to enable all children to have the best outcomes.

Everyone working in, or for our school, shares an objective to help keep children and young people safe by contributing to:

- Providing a safe environment for children and young people to learn in education settings.
- Identifying children who may be in need of extra help, or are suffering or likely to suffer significant harm, and taking the appropriate action, working with other services as needed.

The Headteacher and the Governors of Murray Park are registered under the Data Protection Act. We ask that parents/carers help us to keep information up to date by returning information for checking as quickly as possible. The subject of any data has the right to access the information to check its validity.
